Thornhill Church celebrates 175 years

Thornhill United Church is celebrating the 175th Anniversary this year and has declared October 15-22 "Anniversary Week".
The congregation had its beginnings in 1803 as a group of settlers who met to worship, under the auspices of the Methodist Episcopal Church of America and the preaching of a circuit-rider, at Benjamin Hoshel's farmhouse, near the corner of Bayview Avenue and Highway 7.
From there, the group moved into larger quarters at Cober Schoolhouse where Langstaff School now stands, and worshipped there for 27 years.
By this time, the congregation had entered the Canadian

Wesleyan Methodist Church formed in 1820, and enlarged in the 1840's with the uniting of the British Wesleyans.
The year 1843 saw the church's first permanent building on property deeded by Mrs. Elizabeth Lyons, daughter of pioneer settler and church trustee Jeremiah Atkinson.
That building was moved from the original site to Normark Drive, corner of Elizabeth and Centre Streets in 1852 when it was renovated. In 1883 Wesleyans joined the Methodist Church and a greater union took place in 1925 when it became part of the United Church of Canada.
The Church boom of the 1950's forced Thornhill United Church to seek larger quarters and in 1958, the present building on Dudley Avenue was dedicated.

Anniversary celebrations include: on Sunday, October 15 at 11 a.m., there will be a special Anniversary Service with Dr. Arthur Organ as guest preacher with lunch served following the service; on Friday October 20 at 6:30 p.m. An Old Fashioned Pot Luck Supper will be followed by an evening of entertainment by The Bay Boys, Lorne Greenwood and others.
Special Family Service will take place on October 22 at 11:00 a.m. with guest preachers Rev. Garth and Lillian Nelson. At 7:30 p.m. on the 22nd also, the Church Choir with Mr. Gordon Fleming conducting will present a special cantata, entitled "Sing We Merrily", by Morris Greene. Guests are asked to wear "period" costumes.
