protect farmland About 54,000 acres was purpose of putting it taken out of agricultural before the public for production in York discussion. Region between 1961 and 1976, according to a regional planning document to be considered by council this Thursday.

The regional planning department is advocating policies that would protect the rest of York's agricultural industry. "Of the region's 400,000

rural acres, 280,000 acres are rated to have a high agricultural capability . . . Almost half of this rural land is rated class 1,

highest soil capability. Approximately 57 per cent of the 400,000 acres was in active farm use in 1976. "York shares with

Simcoe County the largest single marsh for the production of vegetables in Canada, the Holland Marsh," states the report. The area represents "at least 40 per cent of the vegetable producing acreage in

In the last census year 1971, farm products from York sold for a total of about \$36 million. The total investment in farming in York is estimated at \$700 million.

The regional planners have split the region's farmland into agriculture one and agriculture two zones, and all nine of the region's municipalities have some agricultural land in these zones. Only in the agriculture two zone is even rural residential development (housing on one or two acre lots) to be permitted.

All the farmland left in Richmond Hill between Bayview Avenue and Highway 404 and north of Sixteenth Avenue is included in the agriculture one zone.

So is nearly all of Markham north of Sixteenth Avenue and three sections of Vaughan, one on both sides of Dufferin Street north of the Langstaff Road, another between Maple and the town's northern boundary, and a third between the Humber River and the town's western boundary

The policy, as drafted, provides that within the agricultural priority areas, the dominated land use shall be farming.

Non-agricultural uses within both agricultural priority areas are to be located in villages and hamlets.

The staff is recommending that regional council adopt the agricultural policy for the


