

ARRIVAL OF THE CANADIAN STEAMSHIP "INDIAN."

QUEBEC, June 27. The Cunard steamer "Niagara" arrived on Sunday afternoon at half past one. The "City of Baltimore" sailed for New York at the same time as the "Indian".

The news that the Montreal Ocean Steamship Company had concluded arrangements with the Canadian Government to a weekly line of steamers had been received in Liverpool with great satisfaction.

Denmark. In consequence of the resolutions come to at the meeting of the Grand Council, at which the King presided, to reject the last German pretensions, a note, which is said to be couched in very firm language, has been sent from Copenhagen to Berlin and Vienna.

Belgium. In consequence of the conciliatory conduct of the King, the public mind is becoming more tranquil.

France. The Paris Exhibition of modern artists opened yesterday. There were above 3,500 pictures.

Italy. It is stated that arrangements are either completed, or in contemplation, for a conference of the Italian Potentates, including the Pope, the Emperor of Austria, the King of Naples, and the minor princes.

Great Britain. The Princess Royal's Anniversary Bill passed the House of Lords on Monday, the 15th. The Oath Bill, by which the Jews will be admitted, not only to Parliament, but rendered eligible for the highest offices in the State, was forwarded materially in the House of Commons on the 15th; some of the clauses having passed by very large majorities.

TORONTO MARKETS.

WHEAT—Yesterday the market was unsettled, opening at 9s 1d a 9s 3d, but closing heavily at the outside figure of 9s (the deliveries for the day reached 3000 bushels).

SPRING WHEAT—The supply of spring wheat has been very small, and prices are exchanged, ranging from 6s 5d to 7s per bushel.

BARLEY—Nothing doing in barley, and no sales on which to base quotations.

POTATOES have been brought in freely by importers from Quebec, Montreal, and the other side of the Lake. For large lots prices are lower, ranging from 4s to 5s per bushel.

BUTTER—Fresh butter has been plentiful throughout this week, and prices have ruled low—ranging from 9d a lb per lb.

CHEESE—We quote American cheese at \$12 a \$14 per 100lbs.

EGGS have not been very plentiful, and are still freely held at 10d a 1s per dozen according to quality.

POULTRY has been in better supply. Chickens have sold at 2s 6d a 3s 6d per pair according to size.

BEEF—The supply of beef has much increased during the week, and prices are now lower—ranging from \$8 1/2 a \$9 for the general run.

SHEEP plentiful at \$4 a \$7 each. Lambs \$2 a \$3 1/2 each.

CALVES are in demand at \$5 a \$8 each. HAY comes in more freely, and prices are slightly lower, ranging from \$20 a \$35 per ton.

WOOL—The market for wool has been buoyant and high rates paid. The principal sales for the week have been at 1s 3d a 1s 6d per lb for washed.

Wool on the market sells at \$5 a \$5 1/2 per load.

NEWFOUNDLAND. We learn from the Patriot that Sir Alexander Bannerman, the new Governor of Newfoundland, arrived at St. John's on the 8th inst., from Halifax, and was received with the usual honors.

WAGES are higher and labor scarcer this summer than they have been for many years. Unfortunately, this does not arise from an increase in trade, or from an increase of any other operations, but chiefly, we think, from the departure from among us of a large number of the "bone and sinew" of the Colony.

HAY CAPS.—The New York Tribune says that some thousands of tons of hay might be saved and much hard work and vexation prevented, if all the farmers would provide themselves with hay caps before commencing their haying.

The Boston Post has been informed that the first telegraphic dispatch to be transmitted across the ocean will be the compliments of James Buchanan President of the United States, to Queen Victoria; and the return dispatch will convey her Majesty's reply.
