

How to operate your snowmobile...and stay alive

Some may love them, some may hate them, but all must agree snow machines are here to stay and should be handled safely.

A safety guide published by the Ministry of Transportation and Communications advises snow vehicles are registered and insured

vehicles allowed on roads and highways and as such must abide by traffic rules and be subject to legislation outlined in the Highway Traffic Act.

Along a municipal, regional road or highway snow vehicles should drive in the part of the right-of-way between the shoulder and the ad-

joining property fence, as far away from the serviced road as possible.

Constable Haak of York Regional Police said the same rules as far as drinking and driving apply to snow machines as to autos and these vehicles can be stopped in a safety check.

Landowners complai-

ning about snow machines crossing their property are always a problem.

Knowingly or unknowingly trespassing on land while operating a snow vehicle makes one guilty of an offence.

On summary conviction an offender could be liable to a fine not ex-

ceeding \$500.

Snowmobiles are prohibited in any park in Richmond Hill, the Mill Pond area and the green belt on the east side of Newkirk Road.

Constable Haak said these areas are out of bounds in the municipality because in the past riders have done

a great deal of damage to small trees and flower beds.

The Canada Safety Council issued a release saying "a snowmobile is as safe as the person who operates it" and indicates a responsibility not just to oneself, but also to passengers, pedestrians, cross-country skiers, and

animals.

Know the rules and regulations of snowmobiling in the area involved, advises the Safety Council, and ensure every rider is familiar with the vehicle's operation.

They suggest drivers start and stop smoothly, keep a moderate speed

and slow down over rough surfaces.

Special advice is given for passengers.

Hold handles, keep feet on running boards and obey drivers' instructions.

To drivers they say, warn passengers of

dangers ahead, for example low branches, and avoid broken terrain.

A special note is added for snowmobile operators and passengers alike. Do not ride a snowmobile after drinking. Drinking and snowmobiling do not mix.
