

# Hill minor midgets miss at Galt

The Richmond Hill Minor Midgets advanced to the grand championship at the annual Cambridge Tournament of Champions recently before losing 6-4 to Belleville.

Richmond Hill dominated play in the first period building up a 4-1 lead.

It was Dave Carmichael putting Richmond Hill in front 1-0 only

seconds into the game. Carmichael then lit the red light for his team's second goal midway through the period and that's the way it stayed until a fine second effort display by J. P. Farrell made it 3-0.

Belleville then capitalized on a penalty for its single counter of the first period.

Then entered Mr. Carmichael again as the

big defenceman whistled home his third goal of the game to put Richmond Hill in front 4-1 at the end of the opening period.

Second period action saw Belleville come on strongly to score two additional goals to narrow the score to 4-3 before the period ended.

The third period saw Richmond Hill put forth a valiant effort in an attempt to strengthen their

lead only to have Belleville pop in the tying goal and follow it two minutes later with the go ahead goal that proved to be the winner.

The Hill then walked into a series of penalties with Belleville notching the insurance goal to win the grand championship.

They then defeated Galt 4-1 after coming from behind an early third period 1-0 deficit. Then it was Cashin tying the game at the seven minute mark from Nye and Gwilliam.

The Hill kept rolling after that with goals by Carmichael with two and Farrell with a single. Assists to Don, Farrell, Mitchell, Nye, Cashin, Lawlor and Lorne Baxter.

Dave Banton of the Richmond Hill team suffered a leg injury

during the tournament.

In league action the Richmond Hill team is sitting in second place with eight wins, five losses and one tie.
