Staff lottery raises \$40,000 for hospital in three years

A successful staff lottery at York Central Hospital that lasted three years, has ended and a new way of raising funds is waiting in the wings.

Employees at the hospital in Richmond Hill have been participating in the lottery, and in three years they have raised almost \$40,000 for the hospital.

Anyone working at the hospital either as full or part time staff, volunteer or board member was eligible to purchase tickets in the lottery, and several ways of contributing were

Staff members had the option of a \$2 payroll deduction each pay day or paying \$50 in cash or by cheque at

the beginning of the year. Board members and volunteers wishing to participate elected to pay the \$50 once a year.

Over the three years, the money collected each year amounted to somewhere in the neighborhood of \$20,000. Some years the amount was a little higher.

The prizes were worth the \$50 a year contribution . . . for the first two years, the prize was \$300 cash each Friday, and inthe last year, there were three prizes of \$100

each Friday. Some people were lucky, and others never won a cent, but for everyone the lottery was fun, especially for the departments in the hospital that benefited from the proceeds.

The Emergency department now has two special tables for treatments . . . tables they so desperately needed. The surgery departments received a Cholodoscope from lottery contributions, and the education services got new equipment as well.

None of this would be a reality at this time, if not for the staff lottery.

In addition to purchasing equipment for various departments, the lottery committee has donated money to the hospital foundation to be used for the Dr. Lillian Langstaff Park, which, when completed will be situated at the north end of hospital property and will be used by staff and patients.

More money will be forthcoming from the lottery later this year as deposit receipts mature.
