Planning committee okays subdivisions

Planning Committee and staff approved plans for three new subdivisions in the Richvale area last Monday night. Heritage-Willow Estates Limited are planning 35 single family homes in a 13-acre setting on the west side of Kersey Crescent west of Pemberton Road.

Tim McCabe planner for the town said this was an "infilling situation" developing a vacant area, that would provide the town with a much needed park area.

Almost five acres will be dedicated to the town by the developer for active park area as well as valleyland with possible trails and bike paths.

BAIF Associates are proposing a total of 147 dwelling units on the south side of Weldrick Road east of Walmer Road.

These units, to be broken up into 53 lots of semi-detached housing and six blocks for street town housing, are the

next stage of development in an overall subdivision plan by BAIF. ARI-J Investments Limited, operated by Ed Silverberg is proposing low cost housing on small lots in the area between Garden Avenue and Roosevelt Drive.

Mr. Silverberg's plan includes 86 single family units and four semi-detached units.

Committee and council

gave draft approval to these increases in housing in the town and plans will now be forwarded to the region and Ministry of Housing for approval.

"We're looking at one to one and one-half years before construction," said planner McCabe.
