Decision on subdivision is expected in six weeks

another six weeks before a decision is made on a proposed rural estate subdivision near Gormley.

An Ontario Municipal Board hearing, set out to hear both sides of this local issue, ran for five full days in the auditorium of Richmond Hill Public Library last

Spring Mills Estates Limited applied for an amendment to the official plan in 1974, hoping to set up a rural estate subdivision on Bayview Avenue south of the Stouffville Sideroad.

The proposal is for 52 two-acre lots on the rolling country-side with a scenic view of Toronto.

"They would be creating a new community with a density of more than the rest of the area," said the resident of the hamlet.

The hearing was held as a result of an appeal by Spring Mills Estates when their development had been turned down by both the Town of Richmond Hill and the Region of York because it did not comply with the official plan.

Planners for the region say the development does not conform to their policy or the policy laid out for the Oak Ridges Moraine.

The moraine is considered an environmentally sensitive area and the region wishes to restrict development on it.

Jane Pepino, solicitor for Spring Mills, said by the end of the hearing she thinks all would admit the area in question is "not

The main argument of the solicitor for the developer was the fact the 105 acres in question are not part of the "environmentally sensitive area' and that the planning staff of the town and the region had both at one time or another agreed to the

within the moraine"

Both sides presented their arguments to the two-man board and members asked for time to peruse the evidence and pass down their decision.

"It will probably be a minimum of six weeks," said acting Commissioner of Planning for the town, Clarence Cheung.
