Minor hockey booming but it's only the beginning

Minor hockey is already booming in Thornhill but there should be other booms to come in the near future as the municipality's population continues to grow.

That's the word from Thornhill Community Hockey League President Bob Sherwood as he winds up his sixth and final season as head of the organization.

Sherwood, Ward 2 councillor for Thornhill in The Town of Markham, is bowing out because "I just don't have the necessary time to devote to the job. Someone else will be taking over at the next general meeting."

By "boom", Sherwood means the influx of new subdivisions coming into Thornhill which will mean "a big increase in registration next year.

"Thornhill needs a new arena and plans are underway for construction of one on Green Lane. This will enable youngsters and their parents to get away from the early and late hours they are saddled with at present time."

In looking back over his six-year tenure, Sherwood said he had "mixed emotions about what we've accomplished. You feel at times you've been successful at what you've tried to do. At other times you feel you've missed some things.

"Overall," Sherwood said, "I think we've come quite a ways from the early days when little planning went into what was then a fledgling minor hockey program."

SOME PROBLEMS

"At that time there were a lot of boys who weren't playing hockey. It was a far more serious situation than today although we're still forced to turn away some players. We hope to solve that problem as soon as possible."

Sherwood said he was still "bothered by the small percentage of hockey parents who go to the arenas and cause us no end of problems.

"They amount to about five per cent of the total parent participation and they are nothing but a headache to everyone concerned. They have no respect for game officials, coaches or anything.

"In the last two years we've had several incidents where we've had to call in the police. Things like this just shouldn't happen."

Sherwood feels that "all in all we have a good house league but there's always room for improvement."

He's especially happy with the league's success in "policing the various teams and keeping fighting to a minimum."

He credits that with the league's "punishment rule which forces a recalcitrant player to sit out his suspensions in full dress, on the bench, without skates."

POWER SKATING

On an even more positive note, Sherwood points to the introduction this season of "a power skating program which can only benefit youngsters teaching them how to skate better."

Another plus was the weekly goalies clinic which Sherwood

considers was a tremendous success.

"We've always had this and that clinics for forwards and defencemen but never goalies. I'm really happy with the results of this goalies' clinic."

On other fronts the THCHL has set up a steering committee which is considering the "advantages of amalgamating with our town representative OMHA teams and operating under one umbrella. Right now we run separate organizations.

"If such a situation will benefit all the players, it will become a reality.'

Financially the league continues to "operate on a very sound basis. With the help of a Wintario grant this year we were able to hold the hockey registration fees at the previous year's level."

The 1979 season will be entering its closing weeks with the Bob Sherwood Selects Tournament in March, the Cup Championship in April and the Town of Markham Hockey Week during the same month.


