COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MUNICIPAL BUILDING, BUTTONVILLE

The Public Hearing will be held by the Planning Committee of the Council of the Town of Markham to consider an Official Plan Amendment for the Langstaff Area and the Holy Cross Cemetery lands.

The subject lands are generally located between Yonge Street on the west and Bayview Avenue on the east, and between the south limit of the Holy Cross Cemetery on the south and Highway 7 on the north. The lands consist of approximately 101 hectares (250 acres) and are shown on the map below.

At the time of preparation of the Official Plan, the subject lands were within the Parkway Belt West Planning Area as established by the Parkway Belt Planning and Development Act, and were subject to the provisions of the Minister's Order

by Ontario Regulation 475/73 as amended. The Official Plan which designated the subject lands as Parkway Belt West Planning Area was partially approved by the Minister of Housing on July 7, 1978. On July 26, 1978, the final Parkway Belt West Plan was approved by the Ontario

Government. The subject lands do not form part of the Parkway Belt West as finally approved and must therefore be redesignated from Parkway Belt West Planning Area to an appropriate land use category. The purpose of the Amendment is to redesignate the lands from PARKWAY BELT WEST PLANNING AREA to INDUSTRIAL, COMMERCIAL and OPEN SPACE, to extend


the boundary of the North Thornhill-Thornlea Planning District (Planning District No. 3) northerly to encompass the designated area of this Amendment and to provide appropriate policies for the development of the lands. You are invited to attend the Hearing and to state your support of or objection to

the proposed Official Plan Amendment. Should you be unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the Hearing The proposed Official Plan Amendment, the Official Plan and existing land use maps may be examined at the office of the Planning Department.
