Bayview outbaskets Thornlea Seniors


The Public Hearing will be held by the Planning Committee of the Council of the Town of Markham to consider an Official Plan Amendment for the Langstaff Area and the Holy Cross Cemetery lands.

The subject lands are generally located between Yonge Street on the west and Bayview Avenue on the east, and between the south limit of the Holy Cross Cemetery on the south and Highway 7 on the north. The lands consist of approximately 101 hectares (250 acres) and are shown on the map below. At the time of preparation of the Official Plan, the subject lands were within the Parkway Belt West Planning Area as established by the Parkway Belt Planning and Development Act, and were subject to the provisions of the Minister's Order by Ontario Regulation 475/73 as amended. The Official Plan which designated the subject lands as Parkway Belt West Planning Area was partially approved by the Minister of Housing on July 7, 1978. On July 26, 1978, the final Parkway Belt West Plan was approved by the Ontario Government. The subject lands do not form part of the Parkway Belt West as finally approved and must therefore be redesignated from Parkway Belt West Planning Area to an appropriate land use category. The purpose of the Amendment is to redesignate the lands from PARKWAY BELT WEST PLANNING AREA to INDUSTRIAL, COMMERCIAL and OPEN SPACE, to extend the boundary of the North Thornhill-Thornlea Planning District (Planning District No. 3) northerly to encompass the designated area of this Amendment and to provide appropriate policies for the development of the lands. You are invited to attend the Hearing and to state your support of or objection to the proposed Official Plan Amendment. Should you be unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the Hearing. The proposed Official Plan Amendment, the Official Plan and existing land use maps may be examined at the office of the Planning Department.

THE EXPROPRIATIONS ACT

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER OF an application by Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario as represented by the Minister of the Environment (expropriating authority) for approval to expropriate land, being parts of Lots 7 and 8, Concession 3 and parts of Lots 7, 8 and 9, Concession 4, formerly in the Geographic Township of Markham, in the County of York, now in the Town of Markham in the Regional Municipality of York for the purpose of the construction and operation of a sanitary trunk sewer in connection with the York/Durham Provincial Sewage Works Programme.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT application has been made for approval to expropriate all right, title and interest in the land described in Schedule "A", and to expropriate a limited estate, right or interest required permanently in the land described in Schedule "B", and temporarily for a period of twenty-two months from the date of registration of the Plan of Expropriation in the land firstly, secondly, thirdly and fourthly described in Schedule "C", and temporarily for a period of sixteen months from the date of registration of the Plan of Expropriation in the land fifthly, sixthly, seventhly and eighthly described in Schedule "C". NOTES:

1. The Expropriations Act provides that,
 - (a) where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Attorney General;
 - (b) the inquiry officer,
 - (i) shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent, and
 - (ii) may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.
2. "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:
 - "owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;
 - "registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper registry, land titles or sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.
3. The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.
