Between jobs, they travelled, The two Swiss engineering developing a preference for the bicycles in Edmonton, Raleigh 3speeds, on the theory that they would hold up better than 10speeds on the unpaved Alaska

They encountered the coldest weather on the whole trip in Arizona, the first snowstorm in 15 years, as they biked across the state.

The ground was so hard, the tent-pegs would not penetrate it and they had to sleep under the stars.

The snow was followed by floods and they woke up one night to find their tent afloat.


After their Arizona experience, the twosome flew back to the warmth of relatives' homes in Toronto, six months after they started out.

Both Peter and Martin said the beautiful country was a highlight of their trips. They also visited the Maritimes and took a canoe trip through northern Ontario.

They are about to return to Switzerland, but look forward to more visits to Canada.
