courses and other reading that we may do. May I suggest that the articles that I will try to provide for you will encourage you to spend a little more time reading the Gospels this Lent, especially their understanding of the meaning of Jesus' death.

(c) Christians during Lent also try to think about the use of their resources. Christians are asked to think about


their life style and how we need to shape it in accordance with the understanding of Christ's life.

Included in this, of course, is the need to take the opportunities to share our wealth with the needy of the world, that we may give to the world even as Christ gives to us.




