Vaulting: George Zivic, first with the highest score of the meet, 9.60; Smith, 5th with 8.45; Hubrich, 6th with 8.25 and Liversedge, 10th, with 7.95.

Parallel Bars: Zivic, 1st with 8.90; Hubrich, 4th, with 8.65; Smith, 6th, with 8.50 and Liversedge,

7th, with 8.35. **Horizontal Bars:** Zivic, 1st with 9.05; Hubrich, 2nd, with 8.80; Liversedge, 4th with 8.70 and Smith, 11th, with 7.65.

In boys level II, Langstaff Gym Club was represented by Jens Rodberg who finished 5th all round with 43.9 points of a possible 60.

He scored 7.2 on floor, 7.2 on the pommel horse, 7.4 on rings, 7.3 on vault, 7.4 on parallel bars, and 7.4 on horizontal bar. A very consistent competition for Jens.

The older boys competed in Junior Level III. Garry James and Scott Thompson, both of Thornhill, represented the club successfully by finishing first and second respectively.

James scored 54.60 and Scott Thompson 53.5 of a possible 60 points for very high event averages.

It was an exceptionally successful competition for the young gymnasts from Langstaff. For most of them it was their first competition ever.
