

## Registration high first soccer sign-up

Indoor soccer registration is underway for members of the Richmond Hill Soccer Club and this may have accounted for the higher than usual turnout for the first day of registration.

Some 200 young players paid their fees February 17. By the following Saturday the number had risen to 447. Notable in Oak Ridges was the number of new players registering.

While some coaches and players have already put in two or three weeks of indoor training, the program will not be fully started until the first week of March.

More than 20 coaches will be giving exercise and skill training in nine divisions of boys' soccer. Tony Lott will meet the girls for the opening session of their indoor training.

The program will continue until the first week of May. At that time teams will take to the great outdoors and there is no doubt but those players, who have already had two months of training, will have a definite edge on the competition.
