Scarborough stand called "sour grapes"

Scarborough's objections to Markham's plans for the Risebrough area have been put down to "sour grapes" by regional councillor Ron Moran. Scarborough council has objected to the proposed secondary plan for neighborhoods one and two of the Risebrough community — a development in the Kennedy Road and Steeles area where Markham plans to house ultimately about 20,000 people. But Councillor Moran thinks the objections are a result of pressure from developers on Scarborough council who have hundreds of unsold houses. Meanwhile those on the

Markham side of Steeles are selling like hotcakes, he maintains. Lower land costs leading to lower house prices and lower taxes may be the reason. Markham planning director Tom Januszewski told council he had finally succeeded in taking his opposite number in Scarborough out to lunch last week, "don't worry, it was only a hamburger," and discovered a lack of confidence in Markham's planning process. The Scarborough planning director had suggested a meeting between some Markham councillors and Scarborough board of control and this idea was adopted

by council, at Mr. Januszewski's suggestion. Scarborough had complained that: —it was unable to assess the impact of the proposed plan on the borough of Scarborough in the absence of a plan for the whole Risebrough community. —the special study area designations at Kennedy Road and Midland Avenue, and east of Brimley Road to the Rouge River should be resolved as part of planning the Risebrough Community so that overall land use and transportation facilities can be planned comprehensively.



Special rally

A car rally with a difference was billed to start at Markham Place last Saturday. The rally featured Jaguar car owners only, but most of the owners decided not to expose their Jaguars to the late-winter driving conditions and brought other cars instead. Markham seeking hydrants

Markham is losing its hydrants this winter and the town's works committee has made some recommendations to prevent it from happening again. Several hydrants, particularly in new, industrial subdivisions, have become buried in snow and ice. The town waterworks department blames it on landscapers who have tried to hide hydrants in berms.

When the problem of a half-buried hydrant is pointed out to contractors, "they invariably just dig a hole around the hydrant which in the winter fills with snow and ice," said waterworks superintendent Les Diack. "A lot of time is spent in locating watermain valve chambers which have been covered by mounds ranging from several inches to two, three and

occasionally four feet of earth," he reported. Fire chief Myrl Smith said that his department was "frequently encountering hydrants that are unable to be efficiently used by the fire department and this is a serious problem in the matter of fire fighting." He recommended that landscaping not be allowed beyond private property lines.
