

Hill student is tops at Science Fair

The York Separate School Board held its "Southern" area science fair last Friday and will send 28 students to the county-wide finals next month.

About 200 youngsters spread throughout the junior, intermediate and senior (St. Robert's High School) divisions entered exhibits from 12 schools.

Judging wound up at 8 p.m. at St. Michael's School in Thornhill and parents and entrants came from as far away as Stouffville. Other schools participating including those from Richmond Hill, Thornhill, Markham, Unionville and Woodbridge.

Ann Faulkner, a teacher at St. Charles Garnier who organized the fair, was especially proud because nine students from her school placed in the top four positions in six different age groups and sciences. One of them, Thomas Kim, won highest overall standing for an individual presentation. He designed an interesting display on holography — three-dimensional images produced with a laser. He used two filmstrip projectors in place of the laser beam.

Mrs. Faulkner said she has a good chance of seeing one or two of her students making it to the national science fair finals in June.

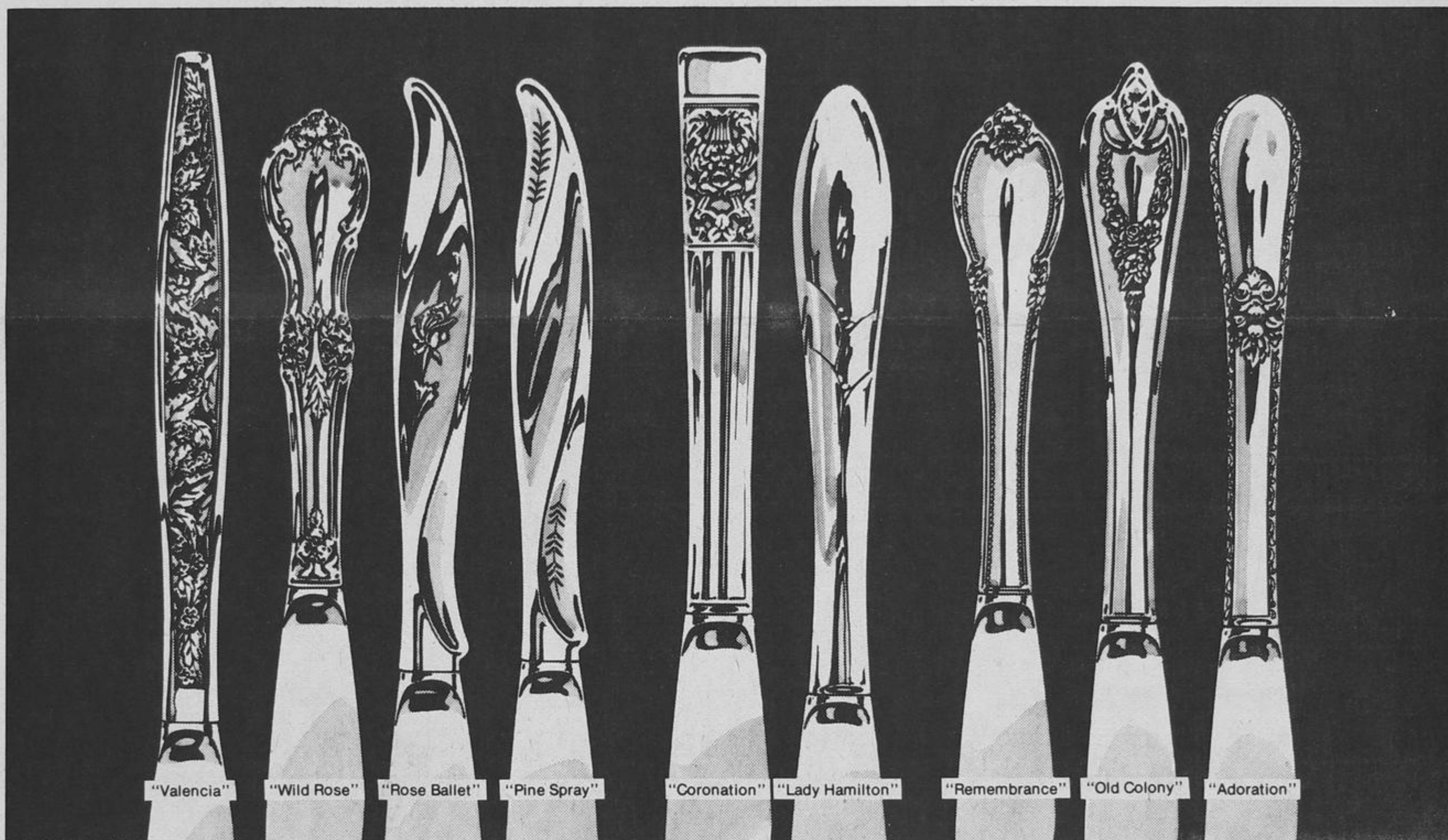

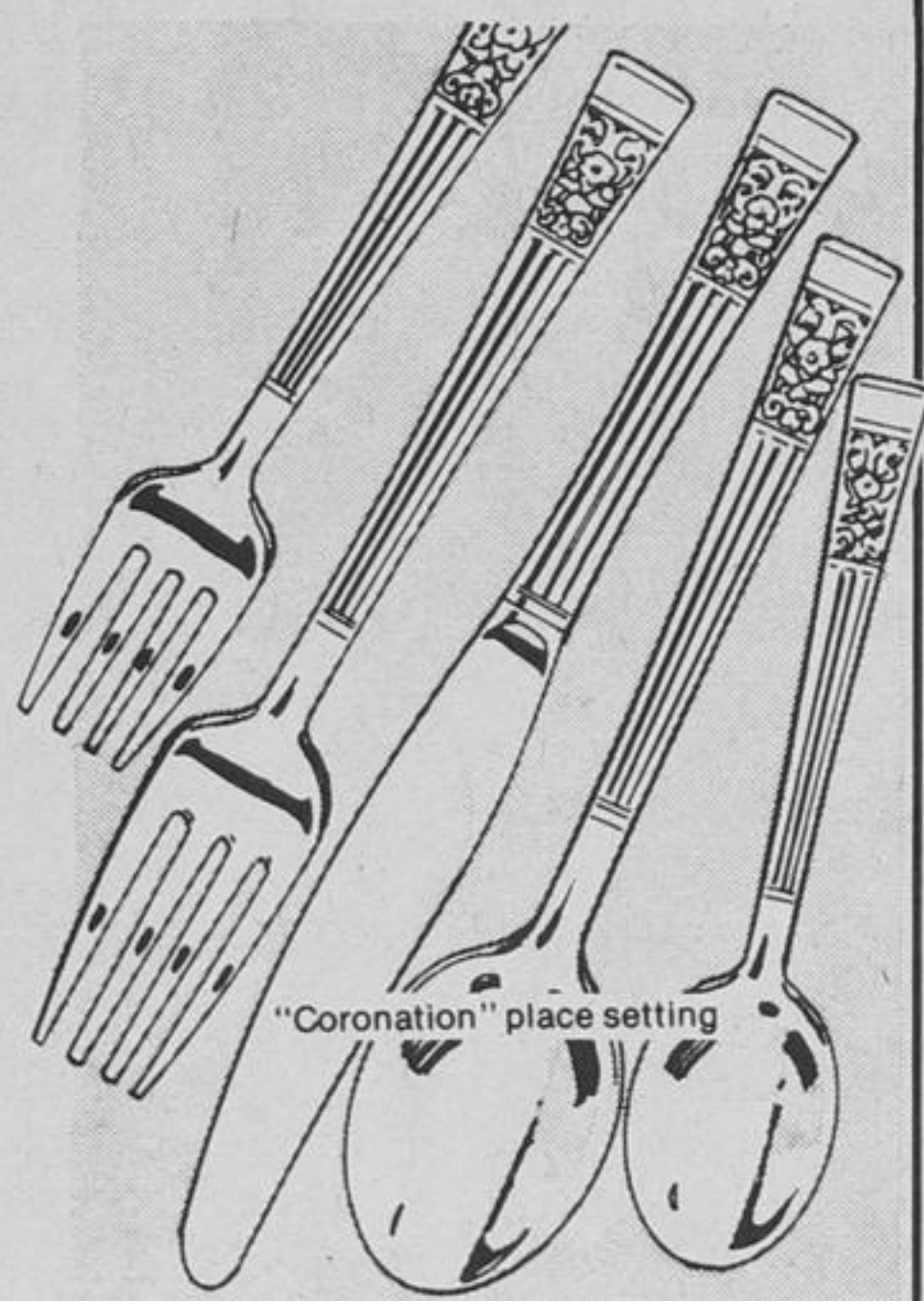
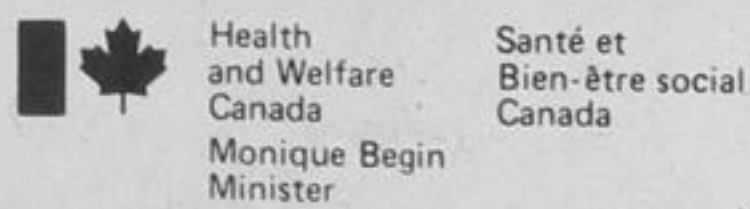
