took control of the game but couldn't get the puck past the Preston goaltender.

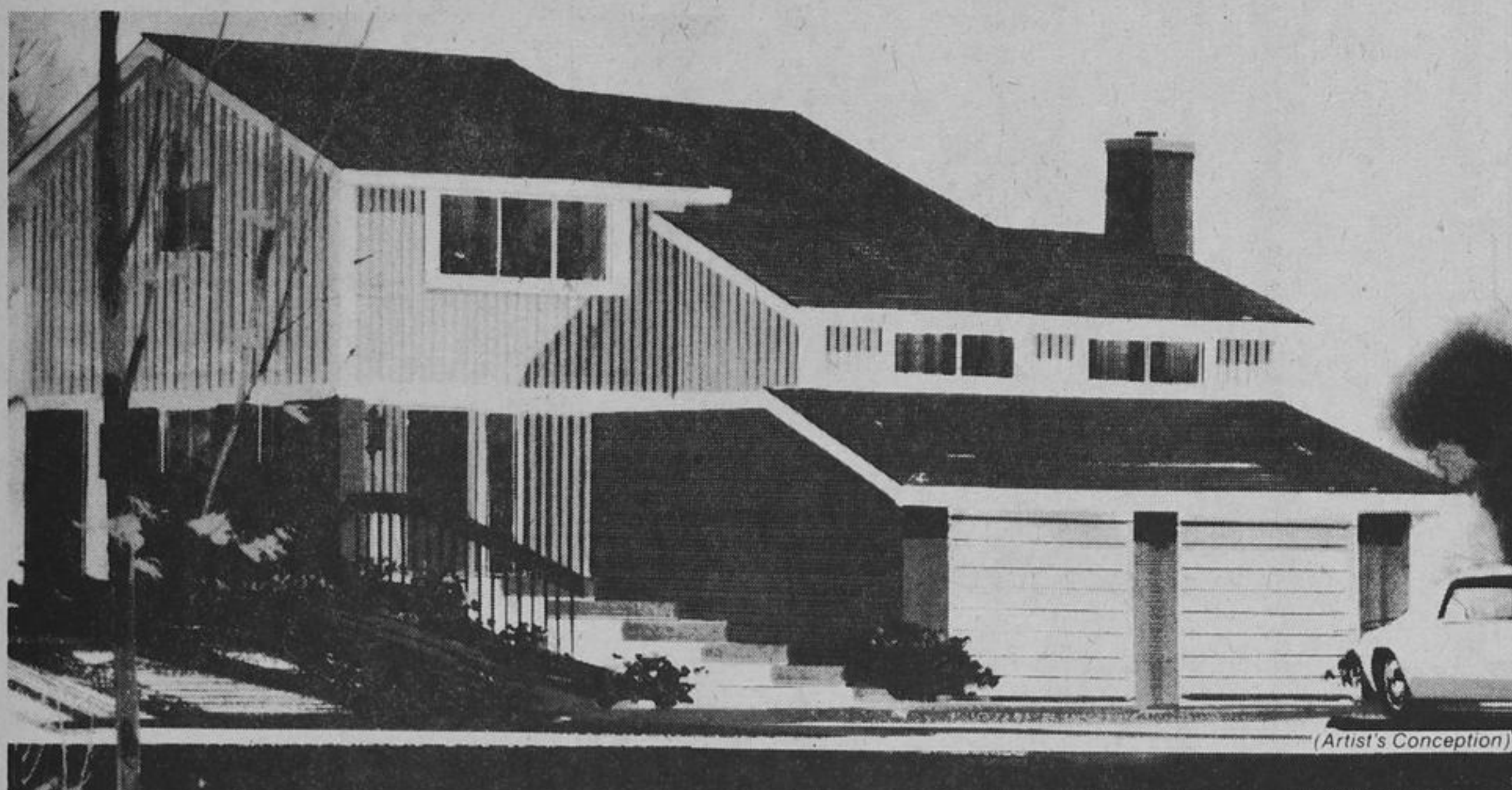
Dickinson was the hero in sudden death overtime as he blocked a shot from the blueline and raced down the ice to score. His team was shorthanded at the time.

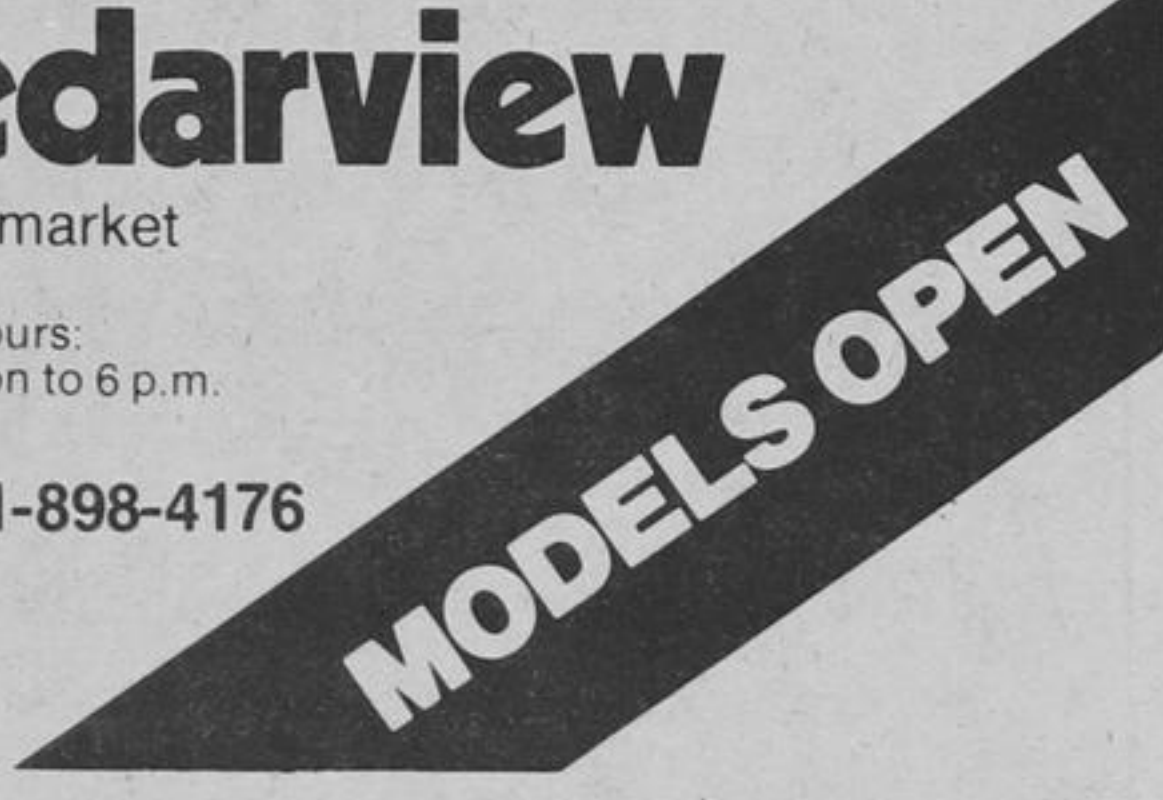


