## Town to follow the procedure against company

After four years of discussions, trial dates and meetings Richmond Hill town council has now decided to follow customary procedure regarding the prosecution of bylaw offences. In 1975 Epic Real Estate in town was charged with having a sign which did not conform to the town's sign bylaw; it was too big. The company was also charged with the operation of a commercial business in a residential zone. The latest event in this ongoing battle between the municipality and a resident was in December of 1978 when Bruno Arsenos, owner of Epic Real Estate, came to council asking them to drop the charges. Council agreed on a five to four vote. The issue was brought up again in January by Councillor John Birchall who felt it was not up to council to make this type of decision without full knowledge of information. Staff will now attempt to get compliance with the bylaw and if the situation is not rectified they will review the case and recommend prosecution to the mayor. Mayor Dave Schiller said he felt this was the best way to handle any bylaw infraction rather than have it become a political decision. "The staff go to great pains to get compliance through persuasion before they recommend prosecution," he said.
