COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MUNICIPAL OFFICES, BUTTONVILLE, ONTARIO The Public Hearing will be held by the Planning Committee of the Council of the Town of Markham to consider an Official Plan Amendment for the part of Lots 14 and 15, Concession 3, and an amendment to the Secondary Plan (PD 13-1) for the Brown's Corners Planning District.

The subject lands of the proposed Official Plan Amendment and of the amendment of the Secondary Plan are as shown on the map below. The purpose of the Official Plan Amendment is to redesignate the subject lands from TRANSPORTATION AND UTILITIES to INDUSTRIAL.


The purpose of the amendment to the Secondary Plan is to designate the subject lands as Industrial-Commercial in accordance with the designations established in the adopted Secondary Plan.

You are invited to attend the Hearing and to state your support of or objection to the proposed Official Plan Amendment and amendment to the Secondary Plan. Should you be unable to attend, written submissions will be received up to the time of the Hearing.

to this board Richmond Hill council unanimously passed a resolution requesting the government rule all major Ontario Hydro undertakings be subject to an Environmental Assessment Board hearing. This same resolution will go to Vaughan and Markham

Councillor John Birchall brought the resolution to council and said the intent was to get a full public hearing on the proposed hydro transmission corridor through the three municipalities that would bring out the facts on both

councils.






