said Mr. Cousens. Depending on where sites are located, the board now pays anywhere from \$10,000 to \$15,000 per acre of land.

It claims if this current deal goes through, boards across the province will be forced to pay in the neighborhood of \$30,000 to \$50,000 per acre. According to the chairman, such a change in prices could tack on an extra cost of \$250,000 for one site only.

"I think my figures are close," he said, "in the next 20 years we're supposed to be building 80 new schools in York County. . . so we're talking about \$20 million more," he said.
