

Epic Realty takes York Simcoe title

Richmond Hill Epic Realty won the York Simcoe Juvenile Championships when they defeated Newmarket in the fifth game of the playoffs after losing the first two games.

Newmarket won the first two games 5-1 and 4-1 but Epic came back to win the final three games 1-0, 3-2 and 6-4.

The fifth and final game was played at Richmond Hill and was a penalty-ridden match with both teams playing with only three men on the ice for most of the third period.

Newmarket opened the first three minutes but Epic tied the game when Jeff Joslin scored at 3:34 with Bruce Buchan assisting.

Newmarket pulled its goalie with one minute remaining in a desperate attempt to tie the game only to have Pleschberger score into the empty net with 22 seconds remaining.

As overtime beckoned it was Inch clearing the puck to Reeves who hit Joslin with a pass in full stride and he drilled the puck home.

That set the scene for the dramatic final big win.
