Classes in England

Here's a 5-week course that's not hard to take

The York Board of Education is offering a five-week study course on British civilization as part of its summer school program, with the help of Brunel University in Uxbridge, England.

The course, which will combine studies and pleasure, is approved for credit toward a Grade 13 diploma by the Ministry of Education.

Classrooms and residence at Brunel (four miles from London's Heathrow Airport) have been arranged through the Student Travel Society of Willowdale.

The course includes lectures and classes for 15 hours per week, tours to places of historical and literary interest related to the curriculum and attendance at musical and theatrical performances in London.

Esther Beaupre, a retired Head of English at Richmond Hill High who took a group of Grade 12 students on a similar trip to England in the summer of 1978, has agreed to instruct and accompany students this summer.

"I hope to be able to expand the course so two teachers can make the trip next year. I would consider going again but it would be good if other teachers could see and participate in the course," she said.

So far only 24 students have had the opportunity to take the course but Mrs. Beaupre claims the program will grow naturally.

The first session in 1977 included such highlights as a visit to Canada House to meet the Canadian High Commissioner, His Excellency Mr. Paul Martin and to Canterbury for a private tour of the historic cathedral.

The \$1,395 cost includes: return air fare and transfers in England; five weeks' accommodation with two meals per day at Brunel University; use of sports facilities there; weekly excursions by coach to places of interest related to course of studies; open-

to-view ticket valid for one month covering admission fees to some 400 stately homes and historical sites in Great Britain; five theatre tickets; all tuition fees and textbooks and comprehensive cancellation insurance and airport departure tax.
