The number to call will be 884-8111, Saturday April 28 from 12 to 12.

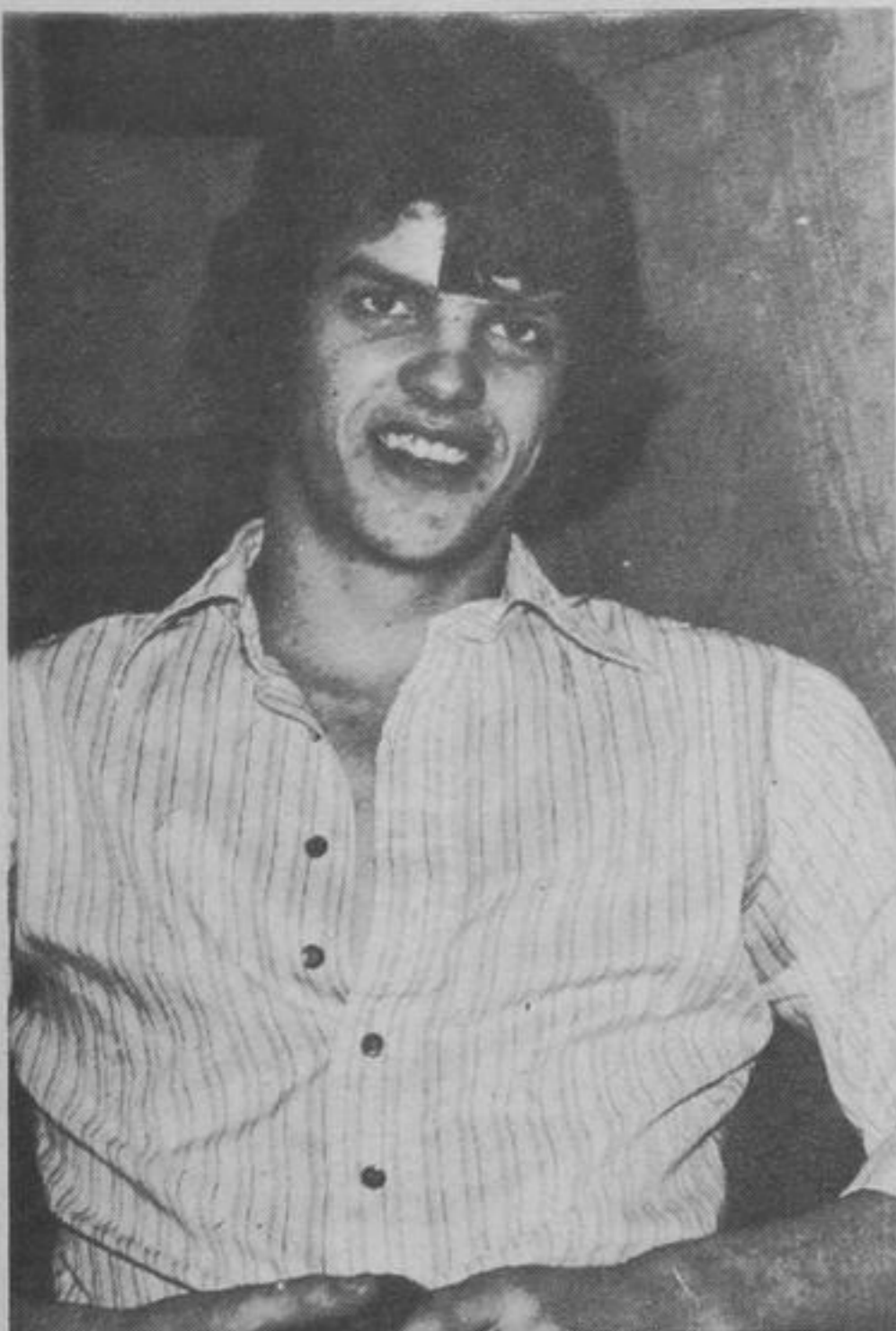
John Horton, Director of the C.A.P. Telethon this year said he hopes to raise the complete \$3,000 necessary to support the 10 children overseas.

"Let's do it for the kids," he appealed, "please... they really need your help."

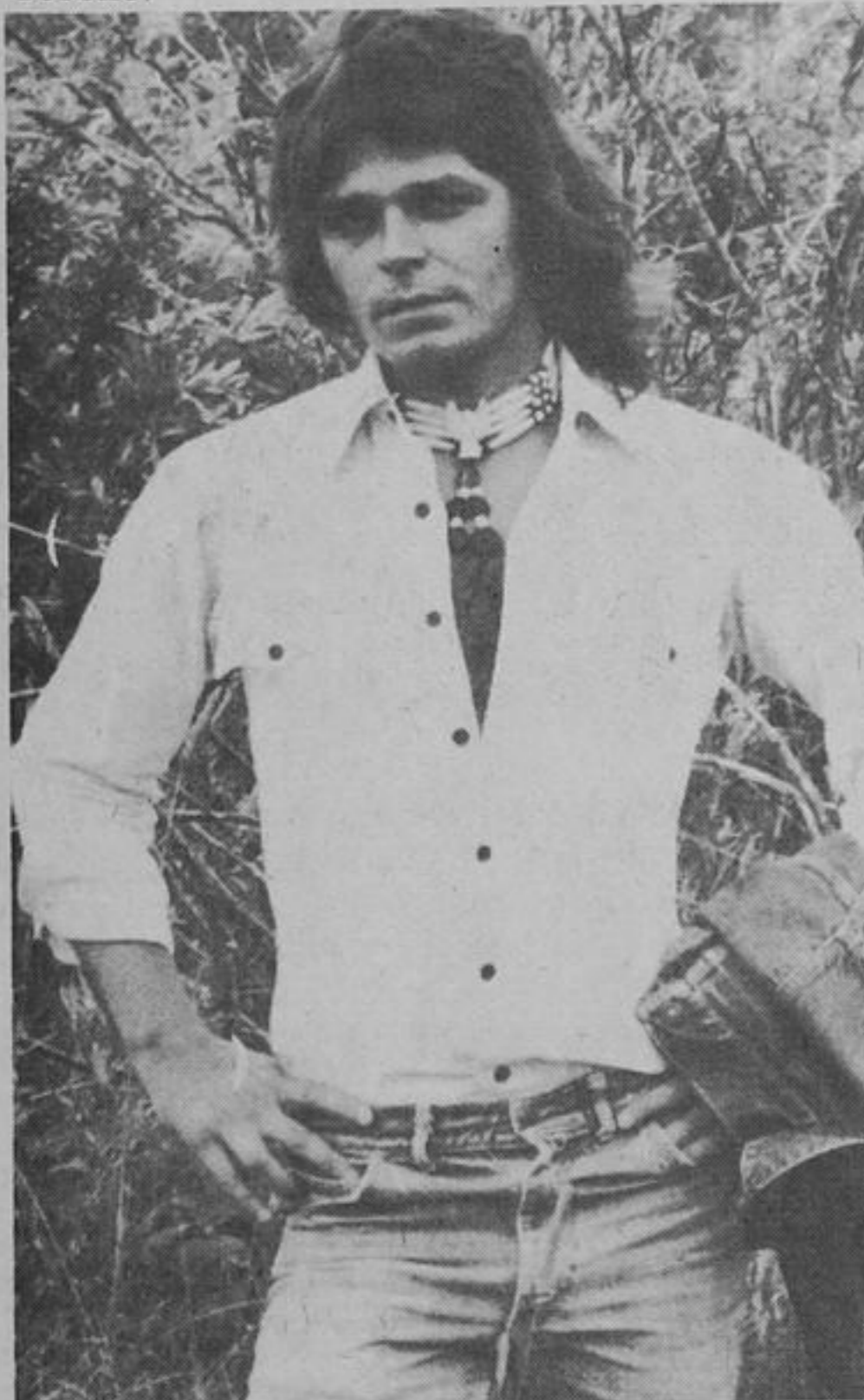

## Volunteer bureau ready for big week

Volunteer Week in Canada, April 23 to 27 gives Sharen Smith an excellent opportunity to advise area residents about the 100 different volunteer jobs she has available.

Sharen is the Volunteer Co-ordinator of Helpmate Information's special Volunteer Bureau and she said Volunteer Week emphasizes needs in the community as well as giving recognition to those who freely give their time.

Tuesday, April 24, Ms. Smith will bring together a number of different agencies in the region at Richmond Hill Public Library to hand out pamphlets, answer questions and tell what they expect of volunteers.

Thursday, April 26, the Volunteer Bureau will hold an open house in their offices at York Central Hospital inviting people to come in, have a cup of coffee and talk to Ms. Smith about what kinds of things there are

to do on a volunteer basis. Tuesday and Thursday are two big days when special activities have been planned, but Ms. Smith suggests anyone with some time to offer, call or come in to the Volunteer Bureau at anytime.

Right now the biggest need in the community is for teachers' aids, said Ms. Smith, in public schools, day care centres and the Operation Catch-UP group.

For horse lovers, the Community Association for Riding for the Disabled (C.A.R.D.) needs people to saddle and lead horses in their program on a farm near Stouffville.

Helpmate's Volunteer Bureau has been open since January of 1979 and Ms. Smith said she has already placed 66 volunteers.

For Volunteer Week, the volunteer co-ordinator urges everyone to "come out—find out—and volunteer".
