Students after \$2,000

Students of Bayview Secondary School will sponsor their 9th Annual telethon for CAP — the Children's Adoption Program — with their goal set for \$2,000.

The show, which will run live from the Classcomm TV studio in Richmond Hill, should start at noon on April 28 and carry through to midnight.

Viewers will be able to phone in pledges for funds that go to support not only CAP but York Central Hospital, United Way, Big Brothers of York and Daybreak, an organization for the mentally retarded.

The Bayview Secondary students, through the cap, support 10 foster children with the help of the Foster Parent Plan of Canada.

That is the largest number of kids getting services and support from any one group in the country, according to Craig Walker, a Grade 13 student and executive producer of this year's telethon.

So far, three local musicians have been lined up to entertain during the 12-hour show. Singer-guitarist Carl Nixon, who is often

featured at a local tavern, has agreed to appear on the show. He recently signed a recording contract with a Toronto studio.

Local singers and songwriters Mike Thompson and Steve Ingram will also be at the telethon. Gordon Lightfoot, Alice Cooper and other popular groups will entertain on videotape from Warner Brothers.

Producing this year's telethon is John Horton, who graduates from Grade 12 at Bayview in June.
