There will be a rummage sale at Thornhill United Church, 189 Dudley Avenue on Saturday, April 28, from 10 a.m. to noon.

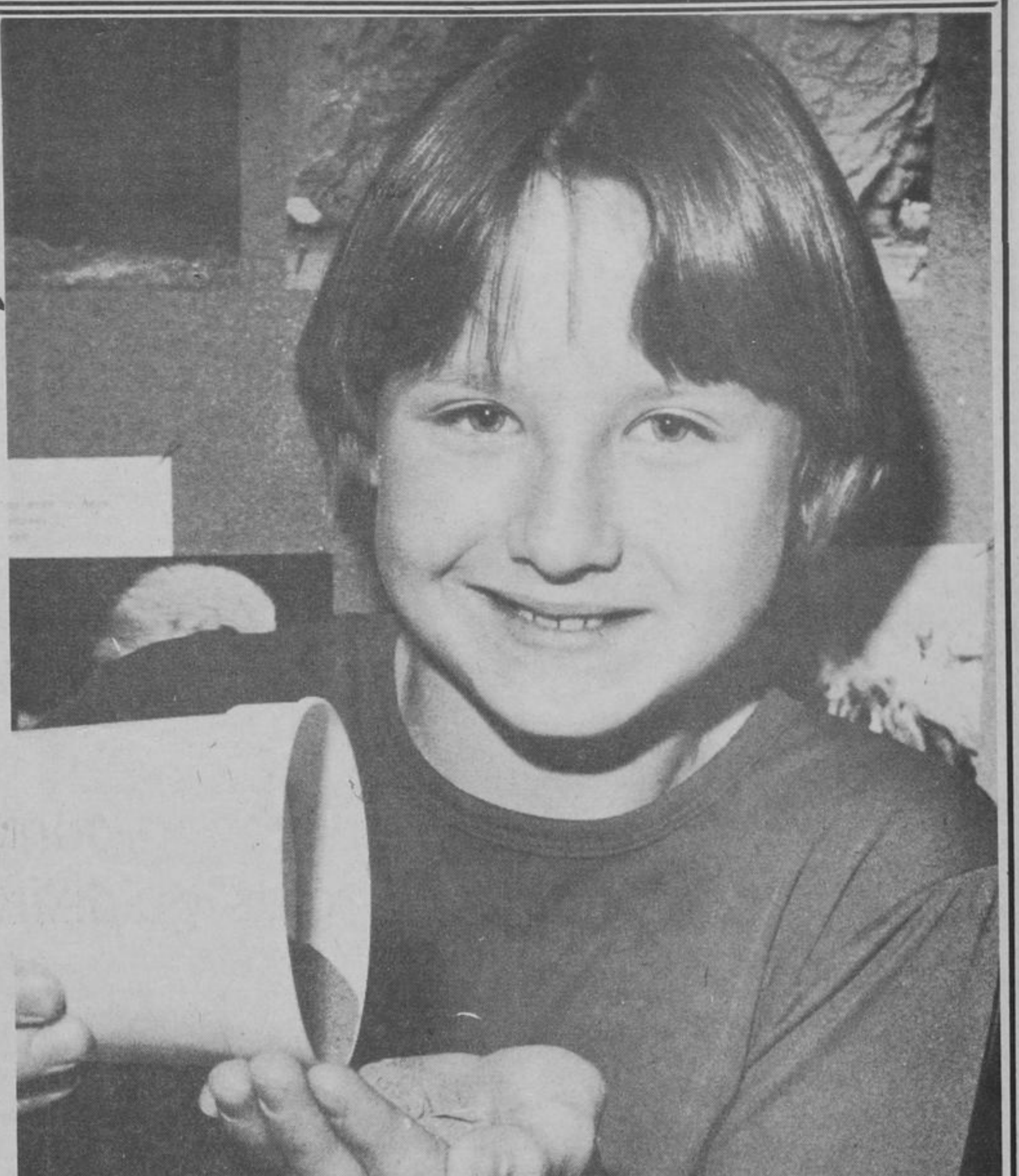
Coffee will be available at the unheard of price of 10 cents a cup. Everyone is welcome.

All ages are welcome, and tickets may be reserved at the library.

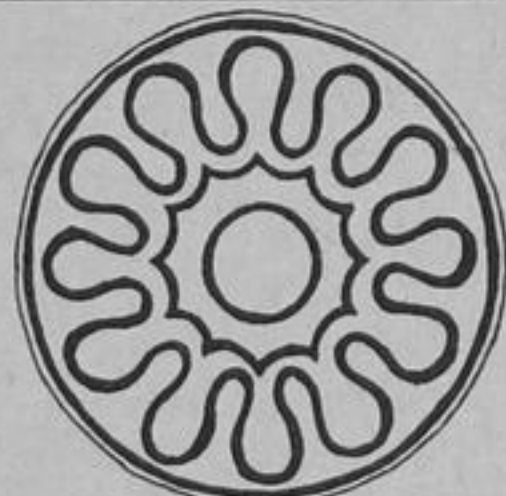
