### Corcoran says no conflict owning land near Estates

Richmond Hill councillor Bill Corcoran owns about 40 acres on the same block as the proposed Spring Mills Estates subdivision.

But it is a big block, one and a quarter miles square. Councillor Corcoran's property is more than 2,000 feet from the proposed subdivision.

"It would be nice if it joined on but there are seven or eight properties in between," he said Monday. "That development doesn't affect my property one way or the other. I have absolutely no conflict.'

The proposed development was endorsed in a 5-4 vote of Richmond Hill council last February, encouraging lawyers for Spring Mills Estates to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board for a rehearing of their case. The project had been opposed by the previous council.

Councillor Corcoran has consistently supported the development proposal. But Mayor David Schiller says that if he was in Councillor Corcoran's position, he would have declared a conflict of interest and abstained from voting.

"It is not up to me to tell him," Mayor Schiller continued. "The

(Municipal Conflict of Interest) Act puts the onus on each councillor to make his own decision."

The mayor had some criticism for the act, too, for being vague. "I sympathize with councillors. They don't know whether to declare a conflict or not."

The mayor sits on a committee of the Association of Municipalities of Ontario which is reviewing the conflict of interest legislation.

It has just been considering the suggestion that a statutory requirement be introduced that a conflict of interest be declared if there is a development within a certain distance from a councillor's own property. The problem is that there are

some bylaws that have a widespread effect such as one approving a shopping mall, and there are others that only matter to the next-door neighbor. Mayor Schiller felt that the approval of Spring Mills would

the action," said the mayor. Even if a judge finds a conflict. there are a number of sound defences that the councillor can fall back on. He cannot be unseated if the lack of a declaration is found to be "inadvertent", which Mayor Schiller says is an

"incredible law" The councillor can also claim that his interest is the same as the general interest of the municipality or that the omission was on a matter too trivial to concern himself about, the mayor

Ann Gold, who was defeated by Councillor Corcoran in the last two elections, thinks the approval of Spring Mills would increase the "opportunity to develop other land" in the Gormley area. But she said she would not take Councillor Corcoran to court. "You have to be awfully sure you are going to win."

Councillor Corcoran practically challenged those who were questioning his judgment to take him to court.

"If I'm wrong, I'm wrong," he said. "But if I am right, those who are saying these things can bear the consequences."
