The bowlers receive individual keepers as well as having their names inscribed on the Master trophy.

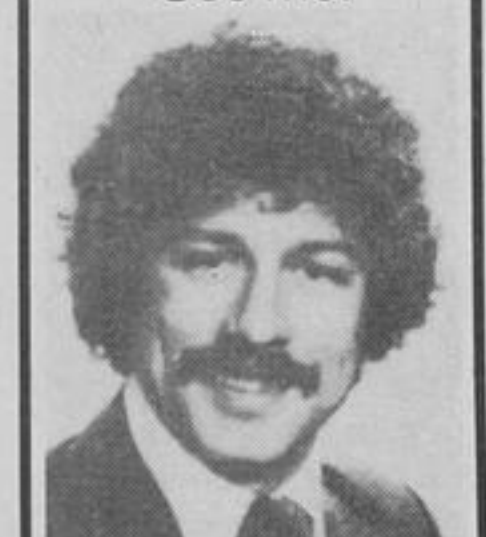
This year the trophy was presented by Gord
