# Alternatives fizzle for Gormley bus

Two out of three options for a bus service into Gormley have not panned out for Richmond Hill's Engineering Administrator, Bud Newton, and he is not optimistic about the third.

April 30, GO Transit cancelled a bus originating in Stouffville, travelling through Gormley and hooking up with the Richmond Hill service, leaving Gormley residents without a mode of public transportation. GO Transit's Manager of Bus Operations, Ron Swanson said the Toronto Area Transit Operating Authority board has ruled the ridership on this line through Gormley was not

## Man risks life to rescue nurse

The son-in-law of Walter and Ina Sinclair of Oak Ridges was honored by the Province of Ontario last week for his heroic efforts in saving a woman who nearly drowned in Lake of the

Woods in late March. Bob Grant, a pilot with the Ministry of Natural Resources, and Brian Clegg, another pilot working for Heli-Voyage of Val d'Or, Quebec, made a daring sub-zerodegree temperature after they rescue received radio information from MOT officials.

A call came into Kenora that a twin engine Piper Aztec with three women and the pilot aboard, had crashed near Kenora at the lake.

By the time Bob and his pilot had arrived on the scene (within 10 minutes) in the private helicopter, the pilot and woman doctor had managed to swim to shore. Upon closer examination, Bob spotted Sally Irwin, a nurse, who was floating in the icy water after the light plane had sunk through the ice, following an emergency belly landing.

Gormley resident Dr. Gerry Gold, who used the bus service told The Liberal, six to seven residents depend on this one bus to ride to Toronto each day.

Mr. Newton also approached Travelways about detouring a bus which travels from Orillia to Toronto via Don Mills Road.

The town engineering administrator said he was informed this Travelways bus could not go into Gormley and back (a distance of one mile) because of timing their schedule is too tight for a 15-minute delay.

The fact there is not a suitable place for the bus to turn around on such a trip is another deterrent to Travelways, said Mr. Newton.

General Manager of Travelways, Yorke O'Flaherty, said this bus from Orillia cannot continue along the Gormley Stouffville Sideroad to Bayview Avenue, apas proximately 50 per cent of

their ridership on Don Mills Road gets on south of Gormley Sideroad.

Travelways did say they would look into making a slight detour into the Gormley Post Office drive, about 500 feet, to be used as a meeting spot for Gormley residents.

When advised of this suggestion Ann Gold remarked, "It's ridiculous", the Gormley passengers then somehow have to find a way to travel the mile to meet the bus.

Mrs. Gold said she feels it is incumbent for GO Transit or municipality to provide transportation facilities to all residents of Richmond Hill.

She suggested GO Transit could direct one of the buses travelling from either Newmarket or Aurora to the Finch Station to cross the Gormley Sideroad to pick up any passengers.

Mr. Newton said his final alternative will be to check into the cost of running a town bus to Gormley twice each day to serve these seven residents.
