

Foundation nearly half way to \$600,000 goal

York Central Hospital Foundation held its second annual meeting Thursday, and since it is the fund-raising arm of the hospital, the figures presented were of interest to many.

The fund raising goal for the near future is at least \$600,000 and to date, almost half that amount

has been raised; in fact \$280,000.

The money comes to the hospital from various sources: the hospital auxiliary, the service clubs in the community, and the business community.

Some money comes from donated funds; for

example, money donated to the memorial fund in memory of a relative.

Of particular interest at this year's meeting was the presentation of Certificates of Appreciation to the managers of five chartered banks in the community.

Five years ago, the five banks agreed to contribute \$15,000 each over a five-year period.

The pledges have been kept, and the certificates were awarded to show the hospital's appreciation.

The banks are: The Canadian Imperial Bank

of Commerce — manager, Ken Rintoul; Bank of Montreal — manager, Linda Davis; Bank of Nova Scotia — manager, Cam Smith; Royal Bank of Canada — manager, John Smith and The Toronto Dominion Bank — manager, Ross Clarke.

Donations to the fund for Dr. Lillian Langstaff Park are also handled by the foundation.

To date \$27,000 has been donated for this purpose. The park will be located on hospital property to

the north of the building, and will be available to patients and staff alike.

The directors of the foundation elected at the meeting are: Chairman-Grace Jackson, vice-president-Bill Kedwell,


secretary-J. Ross Scrimger and treasurer Gail Skinner.
