Centre seeking flexible students

Richmond Hill's Canada Employment Centre for Students is looking for students who are "Flexible" - willing to work evenings and weekends, or prepared to take a series of casual jobs, or two or three part time jobs.

Supervisor for the centre, Monica Janach, said so far this year they have not received many job orders from employers for normal 40 hour a week jobs.

Up to the end of May most jobs have been for post secondary school males to do heavy outdoor labor or factory work, but recently jobs for females have been "picking up" she said.

To date, 683 students have registered, said Miss Janach, but only 145 job orders have been placed, representing about 175 jobs.

Miss Janach expects these job orders will pick up when people know students are available for employment.

"Flexibility is very important," said the supervisor. "Students should look upon part time work as another avenue in their job search.

Students looking for summer jobs are encouraged to drop in to the centre at 10144 Yonge Street to register and employers with needs for summer help can call 884-1584 for information.






