

Legion sponsors field meet

 For the 23rd consecutive year the Royal Canadian Legion will be sponsoring track and field for boys and girls 16 years of age and under.
 Long recognized as the grass roots training level for many of Canada's top athletes, the Legion program has undergone many changes since its inception in 1956.
 Foremost was the addition of a National Championship competition for bantam and midget athletes with all travel and accommodation expenses for the participating teams paid by the Legion.
 The 1979 schedule has now been published and once again a National championship will be held. This year the finals are booked for the Canada Games site in St. Johns, Newfoundland.
 Locally, training for the Legion competitions will commence June 11 (Monday) at the Richmond Hill Town Park on Church Street North. Weekly practices will continue on Monday and Wednesday evenings, 7 p.m. until dusk, until the District E Championships on July 14.
 The District E meet is the first elimination contest on the climb to the Nationals, and the local Tri-Town Track and Field Club will be hosting this initial test.
 The age groups for Legion competition are 15 and 16 years of age for midget boys and girls, and 14 years and under for bantam athletes.
 The high school trackers faced their final test before the Ontario finals with a heavy session at Niagara Falls last Thursday.
 Of the hundreds of athletes who toed the line for the first elimination meet seven weeks back, only three individual and two relay teams have survived to compete at the OFSSA finals at Etobicoke Stadium on June 8-9.
 Thornlea colors will be carried by seniors Sue French, (1500 and 3000 metres), Peter McLellan, (400 metres) and the girls (8x100 relay team, Midgets May Alisedeh, (1500 metres and 300 metres.) Nicole Masil, (800 metres) and the midget girls 4x100 relay team.
 Langstaff High School has high hopes for Marianne Ball in the hurdles, 100 and 200 metres, Liz Marshall in the junior 100 and 200 metres and Heinz Losberg in the long and triple jump.
PUBLIC SCHOOL TRACK
 Only two local competitors attended the postponed track meet from last week that was held at Tottenham on Saturday.
 Mark Dimpfel and Dryw Thompson were among 750 public school runners and jumpers who contested for ribbons at the South Dufferin Mite-Tyke-Atom-Bantam track meet.
 Thirteen-year-old Dimpfel continued to be plagued by the bad luck that befell him in Detroit during the indoor season by recording an identical time in the 100 metre sprint, but being placed second by the judges in the final standings.
 Team-mate Dryw Thompson gained a third place ribbon in the bantam boys javelin and

fifth place in the discus. Both boys now set their sights on the Legion competition slated for July 14.

NOTICE RE. PROPOSED TOWN OF VAUGHAN BY-LAW NUMBER 106-79

The Council of The Corporation of the Town of Vaughan, at its meeting of May 7th, 1979, gave first and second reading to proposed By-law Number 106-79. A copy of the by-law is furnished below.

It is the intention of Council, meeting as Council Committee, on Monday, June 25th, 1979, to hear representation from interested parties regarding the proposed by-law. The meeting is scheduled to commence at 7:30 o'clock p.m.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF VAUGHAN
 BY-LAW NUMBER 106-79

A By-law to provide for limitations on election expenditures by or on behalf of a Candidate in an Election held under The Municipal Elections Act, 1977, as amended, and to require the disclosure by a Candidate of all election contributions to his campaign in excess of \$100.00.

WHEREAS The Municipal Elections Act, 1977, as amended, provides that the Council of a municipality may by by-law provide for limitations on election expenditures by or on behalf of a candidate and require the disclosure by a candidate of all election contributions to his campaign in excess of \$100.00 in the form of money and goods and services;

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF VAUGHAN ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- In this by-law,
 - "broadcasting undertaking" means a broadcasting undertaking as defined in Section 2 of the Broadcasting Act (Canada);
 - "candidate" means a person who is nominated for election to office in accordance with The Municipal Elections Act, 1977, and whose nomination is certified by the Clerk;
 - "Clerk" means the Clerk of the Town of Vaughan;
 - "contribution" includes the greater of the stated monetary value of monies, goods and services received, or the fair market value of the monies, goods and services received by or on behalf of a candidate, but does not include the labour portion of any goods produced by an individual voluntarily for a candidate without compensation;
 - "election" means an election governed by The Municipal Elections Act, 1977;
 - "elector" means a person entitled under The Municipal Elections Act, 1977, to vote in an election;
 - "expense" means the greater of the stated monetary value of monies, goods and services expended, or the fair market value of the monies, goods and services expended by or on behalf of a candidate, but does not include the labour portion of any goods produced by an individual voluntarily for a candidate without compensation;
 - "outdoor advertising facilities" means facilities other than radio and television and newspapers, magazines and other periodical publications, of any person that is in the business of providing such facilities on a commercial basis for advertising purposes;
 - "person" includes a corporation and the heirs, executors, administrators or other legal representatives of a person to whom the context can apply according to law;
 - "polling day" means the day on which the poll is to be taken under The Municipal Elections Act, 1977.
- Corporations that are associated with one another under section 256 of the Income Tax Act (Canada) shall be considered as a single corporation for the purposes of this by-law.
- The Clerk, in addition to his other powers and duties shall:
 - deliver to every candidate a true copy of this by-law at the time of filing of the nomination;
 - examine all financial returns filed with him;
 - report to the Council of the Town of Vaughan any apparent contravention of this by-law;
 - publish a summary showing the total campaign receipts and expenses of each candidate in a news-

paper having a general circulation in the Town of Vaughan;

- maintain a register of candidates for each election held after this by-law comes into force and, shall register therein any candidate that is nominated setting out;
 - the full name and address of the candidate;
 - the office to which the candidate has been nominated;
 - the address of the place or places where records of the candidate are maintained and of the place to which communications may be addressed;
 - the names of all persons authorized by the Candidate to accept contributions on his behalf.
- All documents filed with the Clerk pursuant to this by-law are public records and may be inspected by any person upon request during the normal office hours of the Clerk;
- Any person may take extracts from the documents referred to in subsection (1) upon payment for the preparation of the copies at such rate as the Clerk may determine.
- No candidate who receives an anonymous contribution, or person who received an anonymous contribution on behalf of a candidate shall use or expend any part of the said contribution, and he shall immediately return the contribution to the contributor if the identity of the contributor cannot be established, he shall pay the contribution to the Clerk and it shall become part of the general funds of the Town of Vaughan.
- For each election the amount charged by or on behalf of each candidate in his election campaign shall not exceed the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00).
- Within sixty days (60) next following polling day, each candidate shall file with the Clerk a statement signed by him itemizing the following:
 - Every contribution received by him or on his behalf in excess of \$100.00 and the names of the donors.
 - The total contributions received by him or on his behalf.
 - Each expense incurred by him or on his behalf.
 - The total expenses incurred by him or on his behalf.
- If a person or corporation charges a candidate, or a person acting with the knowledge and consent of the candidate;
 - a rate for broadcasting time on any broadcasting undertaking that is less than the lowest rate charged by him or it for an equal amount of equivalent time on the same facilities made available to any other person in that period; or
 - a rate for an advertisement in a periodical publication published or distributed and made public, that is less than the lowest rate charged by him to another person for an equal amount of equivalent advertising space in the same issue of the periodical or in any other issue thereof published or distributed and made public in that period; or
 - a rate for outdoor advertising facilities that is less than the lowest rate charged by him to another person for an equal amount of equivalent advertising facilities in that period;

then the difference between the amount charged to the candidate or the person acting for him and the amount charged at such lowest rate shall be a contribution to the candidate for the purpose of Section 7 and an expenditure for the purpose of Section 6.

- Any person who contravenes the provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence, and on summary conviction is liable to a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00).
