Review

Stars shine despite hall

There were some bright lights in the Thornlea Music Department's production of the Best of Broadway which ran last Thursday to Sunday.

John McLeod, who is in his final year at Thornlea, is a young man with an outstanding voice.

He has been offered a recording contract and the album by his own group is soon to be released.

A star in previous shows, he did not disappoint this time in his rendition of My Funny Valentine from Babes in Arms.

Lani Wang captured the hearts of the audience with the song "People" from Funny Girl and to you with "Hopelessly Devoted to You" from Grease.

Adrian Prince brought the stage alive with song and trumpet accompaniment to "Hello Dolly."

And there was Ellis McLintock himself, a band leader as well as a teacher for many years, who displayed his own talent on the trumpet.

Mr. McLintock started planning Best of Broadway more than a year ago and has been arranging the music taken from a score of Broadway shows for many months.

Dance numbers worked well especially in West Side Story and Grease and the band performed well in lighter numbers but tended to get loud and noisy at times. The band and the chorus were sometimes flat.

What the performance really lacked most was a proper auditorium to put it in. There was a dead spot for sound at centre stage and about 50 per cent more people were crammed into the gymnasium than could properly be seated, at least on Saturday night. This made it difficult to see the stage without standing up.

Each performance was taped and, when edited, Thornlea hopes to produce a souvenir album of the Best of Broadway.

This will be possible only if a minimum of 350 albums, at the price of \$6 each, is guaranteed.

to BEFRIEND A YOUNG PERSON ON PROBATION. A young person on probation needs the understanding, acceptance and friendship of people outside of their immediate circle of friends and family. It is important for them to know that other people care and are willing to help. As a Probation volunteer you would form a one-to-one relationship with a young offender — to share an interest, skill, or a listening ear. The length of your personal commitment to the young person would vary from 4 to 5 hours a month for a year, or more. To help ready you for this new relationship you would participate in a training program which covers probation law and its philosophy as well as some of the principles of human relationships. If you are a mature person who is looking for an opportunity for personal growth and wishes to give a direct personal service, this is a challenging opportunity for you. to WORK WITH C.A.R.D. C.A.R.D. stands for Community Association for Riding for Disabled and as its name suggests it is a program that teaches disabled people how to horseback ride. It is an excellent opportunity for handicapped persons to gain new confidence and skills, as well as participating in an enjoyable activity. C.A.R.D. instructs children and adults who are physically handicapped, mentally handicapped, learning disabled, autistic, stroke victims etc. Volunteers do not need to know how to ride themselves, but they must be unafraid of horses and physically healthy. You will be assisting the instructors, helping lift people onto the horses, leading the horses as they walk, trot and run, and helping to care for the animals. The program is currently held in Ashmount (Gormley Side Road and the 5th Line), so you would need to provide your own transportation to the farm.
