Senior Project Manager for the Ministry of Transportation and Communications, Len Dutchak, said Highway 404 from Highway 7 to Gormley will not be open until late 1980.

At this time a number of bridges are under construction and rough grading of the super highway is also being done.

This work should be completed this summer with granular base and black top applied next year, said Mr. Dutchak.

The program is designed to encourage and recognize the efforts of the people of Richmond Hill to improve and maintain a high standard of appearance of local properties. It is open to individual residents, commercial establishments, industry and institutions.

NOMINATIONS.

To become eligible for an award, a property has to be nominated for judging. The nominations can be made by any person or company. The nominations can be made with the use of the entry form printed below. Forms will also be available from the Chamber of Commerce at the Town Library and the Clerk's Dept. at the Town Hall.

CLOSING DATE FOR NOMINATIONS.

The last day for nominations is Friday, July 13, 1979. All entries must be at the Liberal office before closing at 5 p.m. that day.

JUDGING.

All judging will take place as nominations are received. As a guide, judges will rate the following areas on a point basis:

1. Originality of landscape design in relation to building.
2. Cleanliness of building, flower beds, etc.
3. Maintenance of trees, shrubs, flowerbeds in relation to pests and diseases.
4. General appearance and color of lawn.
5. Use of color in flowers and shrubs in relation to building (at time of judging).
6. Contribution of property to beautification of the neighbourhood.

7 AWARDS

A total of 7 awards will be presented for those properties which achieve the highest ratings as scored by the judging committee.
