

Region seeks delay in garbage takeover

Regional council voted Thursday to ask for a delay in taking authority over garbage disposal away from the towns and townships.

The region had asked for the authority over all sanitary landfill sites, including the Maple pit if it becomes one.

But Vaughan solicitor Tom Fraser said that the draft legislation "went far beyond what the region had asked for."

The legislation was expected to receive second reading, approval

in principle, in the legislature the next day.

Council voted to request that it go to a committee of the legislature for study. That would delay passage until the fall, according to Regional Administrator Jack Rettie.

But he felt it was important enough that regional council should have a chance to study it in detail.

The draft legislation states that no one shall operate a landfill site without the permission of

the Region of York.

It also states that the Region of York "shall provide sanitary landfill sites".

Mr. Rettie said that if no such site existed when the bill was passed, the phrase meant "that we would have to hustle out and get one."

Mr. Fraser was also concerned that there was no mention of controlling truck routes to the dumping area although it was provided for in another part of the same bill for the Region of Carleton.

Truck routes were a particular concern in the Maple area, he said.

Vaughan was also concerned that the region might get the royalties from dumping rather than the local municipality in which the dump was located.

Mayor David Schiller of Richmond Hill said he hoped that no municipality would favor a dump because of the royalties.

Mayor Ray Twinney of Newmarket and Vaughan Councillor Dario DiGiannantonio were appalled that Mayor Schiller would suggest that any municipal

council would sell out for a few dollars.

Vaughan Mayor Garnet Williams noted that "even a little landfill site will be controlled by the region."

Grants totalling \$396,214 have been approved for 20 projects in the Regional Municipality of York from the proceeds of the Ontario Lottery.

MARKHAM: A grant of \$219,185 will be made to the Town of Markham to share in the cost of constructing a two storey addition to the Newmarket Public Library and renovations to the existing facility.

UNIONVILLE: The Unionville Home Society will receive a grant of \$134,467 to assist with construction costs of a new recreation centre to complement a new senior citizens residence as well as the surrounding community.

YORK: A grant of \$12,305 will go to the Seneca Aero Club to share in the purchase of an airplane.

NEWMARKET: The

King and Georgina are the only municipalities in the region which operate their own landfill sites and King Mayor Margaret Britnell said the concept of regional authority should be opposed immediately.

Mayor Joe Dales said people in Georgina "are quite happy with our own dump and we don't want to import garbage."

Central Ontario Senior Football League will receive a grant of \$9,245 to share in the purchase of football equipment for 8 teams.

MARKHAM: A grant of \$5,300 will be made to the Town of Markham Parks and Recreation Department to share in the construction costs and lighting of three double tennis courts.

HOLLAND LANDING: The East Gwillimbury Public Library will use a grant of \$4,005 towards the purchase of Canadian and French books and furnishings and equipment.

KLEINBURG: The McMichael Canadian Collection will receive a grant of \$3,000 to share in the cost of a series of special musical concerts.

RICHMOND HILL: A grant of \$650 will be made to the Maple District Hockey Team to defray travel costs to attend the Ministry of Natural Resources Hockey Tournament in Timmins.

UNIONVILLE: The

Unionville Minor Hockey Association will receive a grant of \$594 to share in the purchase of trophies.

MARKHAM: A grant of \$393 will be made to the Markham Aquatic Club to defray travel and accommodation costs to the Ontario Age Group Swimming Championships in Thunder Bay.

MARKHAM: A grant of \$2,100 will go to the Markham Minor Midgets Hockey Team to defray travel expenses to attend a hockey tournament in Winnipeg.

MARKHAM: A grant of \$1,475 will go to the Markham Tennis Club to assist with the cost of resurfacing three tennis courts at Reesor Park.

NEWMARKET: The York Pioneer and Historical Society will receive a grant of \$1,952 towards renovations to the Queensville Library.

SUTTON WEST: A grant of \$117 will go to the Georgina Badminton Club to share in the purchase of badminton equipment.

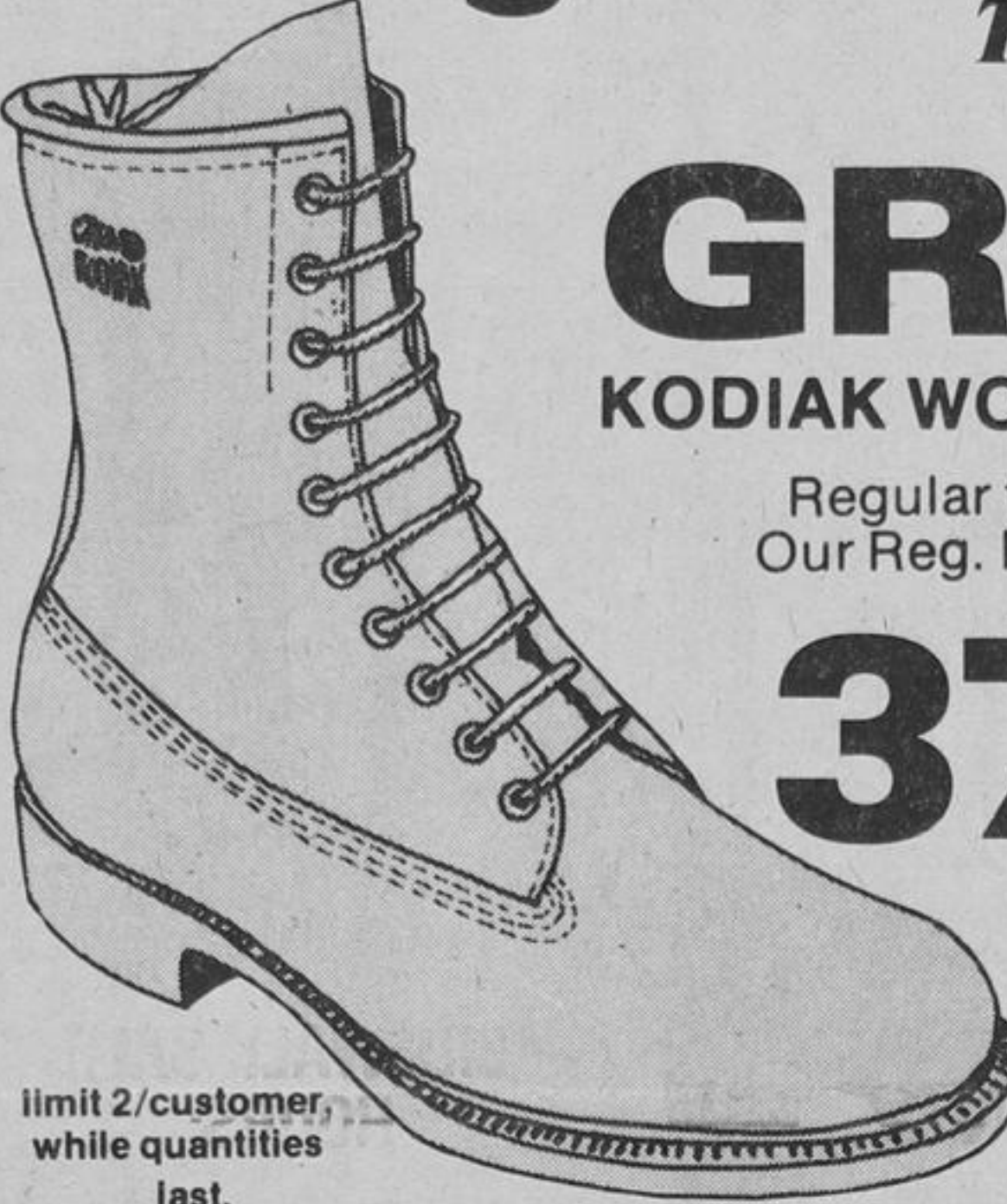
