

Parents upset about pupils going to new school

Angry about feeling left out of a decision affecting the education of their children, about 30 parents from Concord gathered at M. L. McConaghy Public School Wednesday to find out why their kids will attend there for a year.

The historic building, declared surplus by the York County Board, has been leased by the Separate School system

and renamed Our Lady of the Rosary.

The parents, who were openly hostile at the outset of the evening, were told trustees agreed the night before to give students and parents a chance to decide which school they'd rather attend — St. Anthony's in Markham or the temporary location of Our Lady of the Rosary —

until a new permanent facility can be built in Glen Shields.

One of the board's large enrollment problems for this coming September is centred in the new subdivision of Glen Shields in Vaughan.

It expects to have between 300 and 400 pupils from that area by next March and occupancy of new

homes now under construction begins in late August and carries on through November, for the first phase.

Information received from salespeople by the board shows that 85 per cent of the new residents moving into Glen Shields will be Separate School supporters. For the people of Concord, an area which has been

waiting for a new school for nearly four years, this is both good and bad news.

The population explosion created by the new homes means the school board will push the ministry for a new school in Glen Shields to be ready no later than Christmas, 1980. It has already been turned down twice for allocation for a

permanent school because of a lack of students.

About three years ago, 25 students from Concord were bussed to St. Luke's School in Thornhill because it was the closest school to their area. Some of the residents have lived in that small community at Highway 7 and Keele St. for 10 years and have become accustomed to

bussing their children up to 10 miles away.

Last year, the board changed the attendance boundaries and 38 Concord children were transported to St. Anthony's on Kirk Drive in Thornhill. Now the board wants them to consider another change so they can become part of a new school which will ultimately be based in

Glen Shields.

It feels if the children from Concord and those moving in can grow together and build their own school spirit at the former McConaghy School, it will be much better if they are transported as a solid unit of teachers, children and principal once the real Lady of the Rosary is ready.

Director of Education John Zupancic said the decision to lease McConaghy was necessary so the board can get allocation for permanent building. Glen Shields instead asking for a relocatable structure, which really means building twice for the same children.

The Board takes over officially Aug.
