

Two-car garage unsightly, neighbors say, but legal

Some people would like to see less government restrictions, but

some would still like to see more. At the Town of Richmond Hill engineering committee meeting last Thursday Kathleen Beasant and Raymond Carter of 435 and 439 Taylor Mills Drive South objected to a garage constructed to the rear of their property.

"It mustn't be called a garage," corrected Mr. Carter, "it's more like a factory — or a

commercial structure. Mr. Carter was describing a mutual two-car garage built between the property of Thomas Heatherington and John McLaughlin at 434 and 438 Lynett Crescent, which neighbours find offensive because of its height, 12 feet, six inches, its design, a flat roof rather than peaked as the homes in the area, and construction material concrete blocks rather than brick like the homes.

"It looks terrible," said Mr. Carter.

The Taylor Mills Drive resident was asking the town to do something about the building but was informed by the committee the structure complied with all the bylaw requirements.

Councillor Mike Burnie agreed with Mr. Carter, about the appearance saying the structure "totally changed the neighbourhood", but added "It's incredible - but it's within the

Councillor Al Duffy advised Mr. Carter the town building bylaw had restrictions of placement and height, but did not control design.

"The town's not ready for an architectural control bylaw," he said, adding one of the difficulties is that not all agree on what is a good design.

Chairman of the engineering committee, Councillor Bill Corcoran, smoothed the situation by advising Mr. Carter and Mrs. Beasant the committee would suggest the two owners of the "offensive" building be requested by the town to use some sort of plantings, ivy, hedges or some green foliage, to screen the building and make it

"less obnoxious" Mr. Carter also speculated the structure was to be used for something other than a garage. Committee members assured Mr. Carter the proper steps would be taken to ensure a business was not operated from

the premises. In an interview with The Liberal, one of the garage owners, John McLaughlin, said the building was to be used as a wo-car garage with a storage area above for articles which usually fill a garage.

There was no intention to use he building commercially, he said.
