Bernice Lever attends conference in Ottawa

By GEORGIE BURKHOLDER When I mentioned that I had not been able to get my hands on a copy of her book, "Excuses", Bernice Lever very kindly stopped by my house and left me a copy. Bernice Lever is Thornhill's author, teacher and president of the Richvale Writers' Club, (and the most unbelievably young grandmother you will ever see) who has just returned from a five-day conference in Ottawa, sponsored by the Canadian Author's Association. There, she attended workshops, talks and heard guest speakers including editors of other Canadian publications. The conference was addressed by representatives of the Ottawa National Library, the copyright office and experts in the field of historical novels, fiction, poetry and journalism. "The greatest part of the whole conference",

Bernice says, "was the awarding of the prizes for literature, some of them amounting to \$5,000." About 20 delegates attended from the Toronto area. Besides being editor of York University's "Waves", Bernice acts as advisor for "Fireweed", contributes to Canadian Author and Bookman; copy edits for a California book company and has nearly 100 poems, short stories, interviews and reviews in print from Stockholm, Sweden, across Canada to Sydney, Australia. Following her recently published book, "Excuses", will be a book of poems: "Woman, I Am" and an anthology of prison writing by women called "Singing". These books will soon be available. Her books are beautifully illustrated by her son, Gordon Fisher. In 1977 Gordon launched his own studio in Toronto called "The Designer's Edge".

As if all these activities did not serve to keep Bernice amply occupied, she will be teaching a class in creative writing at the Ontario College of Art this summer. With Paul Murray of Thornlea Secondary School, Bernice Lever is conducting a contest, the subject of which is "What it was like to be a child in Thornhill 100 years ago". Prizes are to be awarded by the sponsoring Thornhill Historical Society to the lucky winners of cash and books on Thornhill Festival Day in September. There are three categories: under 12, under 15 and under 19. All area students are eligible and entries may be sent to Bernice Lever, 79 Denham Drive, Thornhill. Next meeting of the Richvale Writer's Club will be held on Thursday, July 5 at Bernice's Denham Drive home. New members are welcome.
