her nearest challenger, Miss Teno's home club is the Lakewood in Essex County.

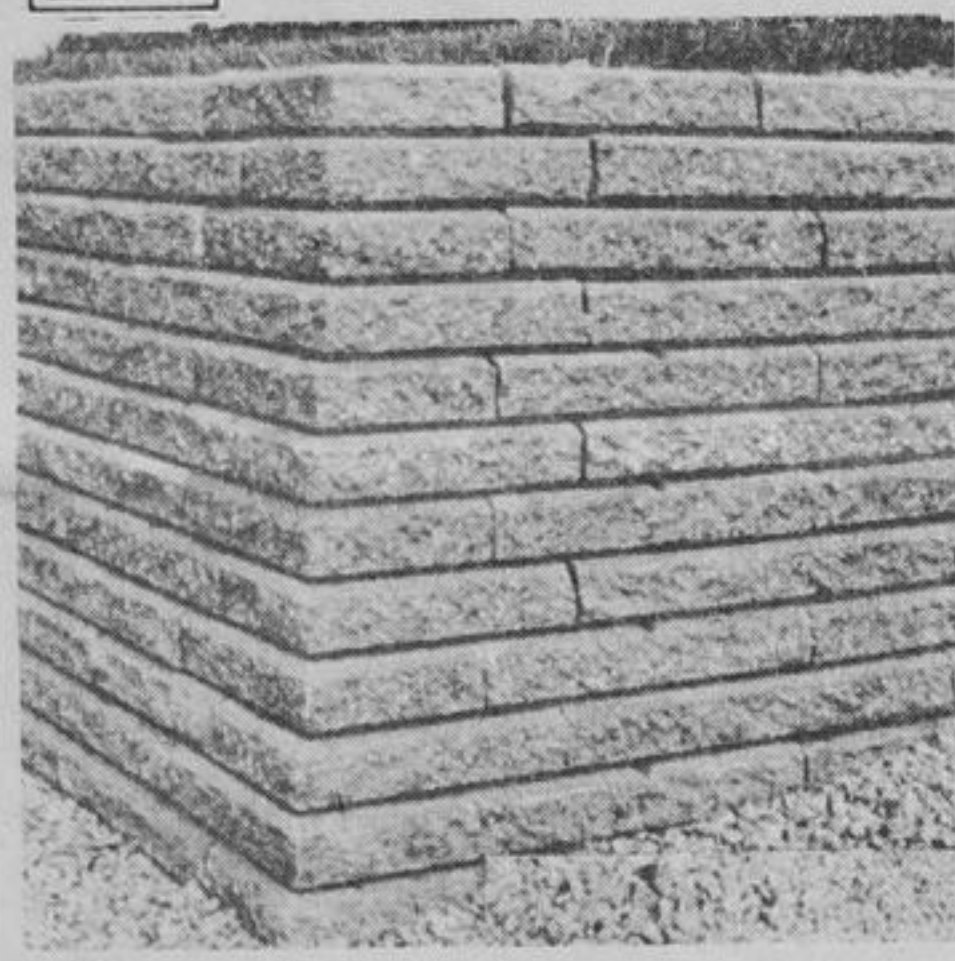
Runner up from a club in Sault Ste. Marie, shooting a 78-81-85 for a three-day total of 244, was Brenda Burns.
