What do you do with 1,000 patio tables?

When Joe Dwyer arranged to have more than 1,000 patio tables delivered to his home, he didn't expect to have to sell them one by one.

While travelling through the west, Mr. Dwyer decided to look up an airforce buddy in Rosetown, Saskatchewan.

After reminiscing and catching up on years of separation, a coincidence became apparent — both men worked in associations for the mentally retarded.

Joe Dwyer is past Executive Director of York County Association for the Mentally Retarded and presently Executive Director of Newmarket Association for the Mentally Retarded while his friend turned out to be a volunteer in the association for Mentally Retarded in Rosetown, Saskatchewan.

The two went to look at

Wheatland Regional Centre, a workshop where mentally retarded adults made furniture.

The latest item of construction was a 20-inch high, 30 inch diameter, collapsible, patio table

made from B.C. cedar.

Mr. Dwyer made arrangements to get a trailer load of the tables to distribute in the east, but was unable to market them in quantity as he had expected.

The tables are now available from Joe Dwyer at 884-2706 at \$14.50 each.

All monies go to the Mentally Retarded Association in Rosetown, Saskatchewan.
