## Counselling service gets annual grant

York Region's Credit Counselling Service has received its annual grant from the Ontario Ministry of Community and Social Services of \$25,751. The grant covers 60 per cent of the agency's operating expenses with the remainder coming from the United Way of York Region, the Region of York and credit granters. Carol Fraser, the service's full-time counsellor, says 169 new cases were taken on in the last fiscal year, and the monthly caseload involves about 200 people.

They are referred to the service by creditors, friends who have used the service, lawyers, physicians, "or they may have heard about us on the radio." Most of the service's work involves assisting individuals with debt repayment programs. The client brings his pay cheque or whatever to the service and the money is then distributed to creditors on a pro-rata basis. A smaller part of the caseload involves helping individuals set up personal budget.

The service employs Mrs. Fraser, a full-time and a part-time secretary, to do this work. Mrs. Davis said that the rising cost-of-living is certainly a problem for people on fixed incomes. But the major cause of trouble with creditors is the easy availability of credit. "People don't think about going into debt until it is too late." The credit counselling service is affiliated with the family services agencies in York Region. Its Richmond Hill office is at 10225A Yonge Street North in the same building as Richmond Hill and Thornhill Area Family Services. The telephone is 884-9140.
