Yonge Street is key to Hill's success

What is seen as progress for some is not necessarily described that way by others.

Eighty-two-year-old Elmer Boynton, of Richmond Street, likes to look back on the days when people were more "at ease" and "there wasn't the turmoil in the world there is now."

Mr. Boynton was born in the white clapboard house located on the site of Country Place Nursing Home on Elgin Mills Road east of Bayview Avenue, in 1897.

Shortly thereafter, he moved with his family to a farm house (no longer standing) in the Pleasantville area of Richmond Hill.

As a boy he remembers Richmond Hill when there were three boot and shoe stores ("People did a lot of walking in those days," he explained), two hotels and a dry goods and grocery store on Yonge Street.

Mr. Boynton walked to a school located where McConaghy Public School now stands, passing each day the century home of

Richmond Street where he has lived for 20 years. His most vivid memories include trips to a foundry located on Major Mackenzie Drive, across from where York Central Hospital now stands.

More than 50 years ago, Mr. Boynton was one of a helping crew to clear lands for the Summit Golf and Country Club, by horse and team — at \$5 a day. The job took two years, he remembers.

Richmond Hill holds many good memories for Mr. Boynton and although he said he liked it better in "Those days", he said he feels Richmond Hill town council has done a "pretty good" job in the planning process of the town.

Good planning and housing restrictions have helped, he said, because you "just can't stop progress."

To this resident of Richmond Hill, Yonge Street is the key to the success of the town.

"If a man has money and time and gets on Yonge Street, he can branch off anywhere he wants to go," he said.
