Richmond Hill councillor Al Duffy thinks it's about time the town started catering a little bit to bicycles instead of always to cars.

"It seems," he said, "that whenever we're alloting money out to various projects it has to do with providing parking for cars. Why not do it for bicycles for a change?" Duffy's remarks came at a Richmond Hill Parks

and Recreation Committee meeting dealing with a proposed construction of a bicycle path on the east side of Yonge Street from Highway 7 to Markham Road. They were inspired by a staff report that the Ministry of Transportation had refused to

report said. It went on to explain that "if MTC had agreed to pay the cost of the Yonge Street cycling path staff would not object, but now that the Town is expected to pay staff would recommend it not be proceeded with at this This brought Duffy to

the fore along with Councillor Mike Burnie, parks and recreation committee chairman, in favor of a Yonge Street bicycle path.

"I think we should do it now while we have the opportunity," said Duffy. 'Ten years from now it will cost a lot more. Even so, you'll never get a \$48,000 price tag on a bicycle path anywhere else for this money. It'd cost you much more right

Councillor Burnie thought it would be an 'excellent way to get people to use that part of the town."


