

# Rec Ladies hit playoff trail

Smitty's Brake Stop managed to hang onto first place in the Richmond Hill Ladies Recreational Softball League but it wasn't easy. They were hardpressed in the final game as Best Way Stone battled them right down to the wire before losing 22-21 and settling for second spot, just one point behind.

forced the game to be called after five complete innings.

The two remaining teams will then play off in a sudden death 'A' and 'B' championship series on Friday evening, September 7 at Crosby Park.
