The girls' program, which is offered to recreational gymnasts aged three and up, is a little more expensive. Because of the high calibre of coaching, fees are \$5 per hour, \$3.90 if you come twice per week and \$3.10 per hour if participants attend three times weekly.

Adult gymnastics and ladies' fitness sessions are also offered. The club, especially the young girls section, stresses participation and performance.


recreation and the participation. There is another gymnastics club on the same street that tends to stress excellence in competition.
