King tour covers five homes and a store

Members of the York Central Hospital Auxiliary, King Branch, are extending an invitation to anyone to drool over some splendid homes in King Township.

This year the second annual Autumn Tour of Country Homes will be conducted through five private homes and a country store. Proceeds will go to York Central Hospital.

There are homes in the tour

this year to delight all tastes — traditional, contemporary and modern.

Arrows in strategic locations will mark the route of the tour and homes may be visited Thursday, September 20, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Dr. and Mrs. William Francis have opened their unique home built entirely of fieldstone, wood and glass and spectacularly situated on one of the highest

points in King Township, to help raise funds for the hospital.

Due to the narrow driveway at this home (over a mile in length), cars are asked to park on the concession and take a shuttlebus service provided free of charge by Langdon's Coach Lines.

All homes on the tour are tastefully and elegantly decorated, beautifully landscaped, spacious, well equipped, and each have points appealing to

different tastes.

For example one home on the tour has an extraordinary games room which is sure to delight the young and the young-at-heart, while another, mediterranean in design, boasts a round red bathtub in the main bathroom and an elevated circular bed in the master bedroom.

Included on the tour is a charming old church which has been converted into a unique

residence, complete with antiques and Canadiana.

For those interested in this period, a century home built in 1859 with the original section dated back to as early as 1830, complete with old-world charm.

Of special interest in this home is an extensive collection of English plates and cranberry glass.

Something a little different this year is the inclusion of Kettleby

Country Store on the tour with antiques, works of local artists, stained glass and dried flower arrangements attractively displayed.

Barry Dimock of "The Herb Homestead" a columnist for the monthly magazine "Early Canadian Life" will be on hand to give advice about "Herb Gardens in Winter," and "How to Grow Herbs for Flavor and Fragrance".
