

Richmond Hill company leads in heat recovery

A young Richmond Hill company is leading the nation in heat recovery methods for industrial or institutional uses.

John Harry, president and owner of Longhill Energy Products Limited, located on Markham Road, said two-and-a-half years ago he saw a need for a company specializing in energy conservation.

A concept for a heat-recovery device shared with a Richmond Hill engineer named Phil Breeze, led to the manufacture and sale of a complete line of heat recovery packages — made in Richmond Hill and sold all over Canada.

Warm or hot exhausts run continuously from many industrial plants.

Mr. Harry's idea was to transfer this heat to fresh

air drawn into the building, fresh air that is preheated during the cold season for the comfort of employees.

One of the ways this is accomplished, said Mr. Harry, is by use of a heat wheel.

A heat wheel has a rotating cylinder packed with a heat storing

material, in its simplest form.

Contaminated air is exhausted through the wheel on one side trapping heat in the media.

Fresh air is drawn in the opposite direction and recovers the heat.

Peter Sutton, Sales Engineer for Longhill Energy Products, said

when they approach companies about their product they advise the cost of the system and show the number of years it will take for the system to pay for itself, through energy savings.

"The payback period is coming down as gas prices escalate," said Mr. Harry.

"Canada has been throwing out millions of BTU's (British Thermal Units)" said Mr. Sutton.

The need for improved energy efficiency is immediate and Longhill Energy Products have come up with one answer to a national problem.

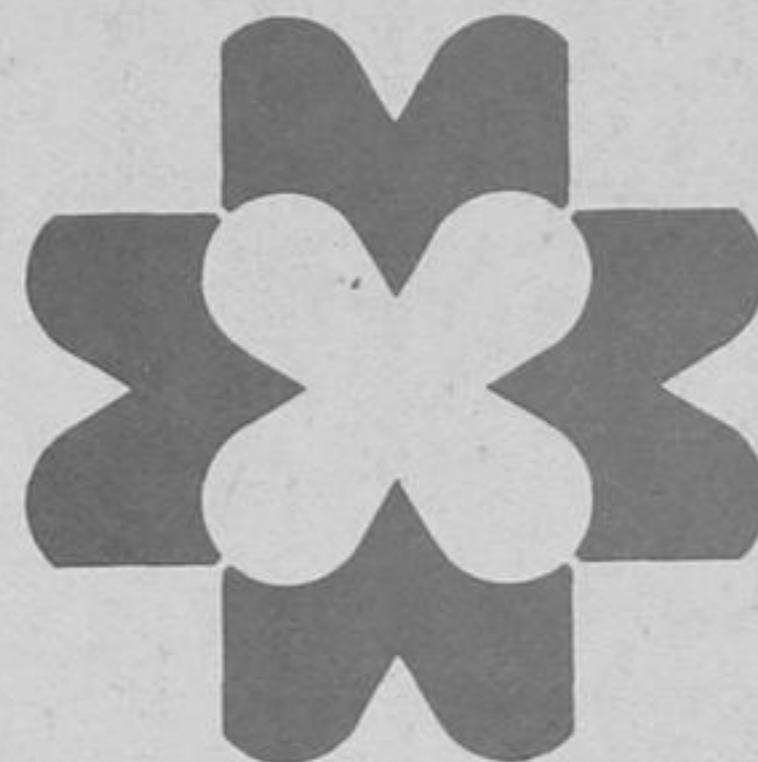

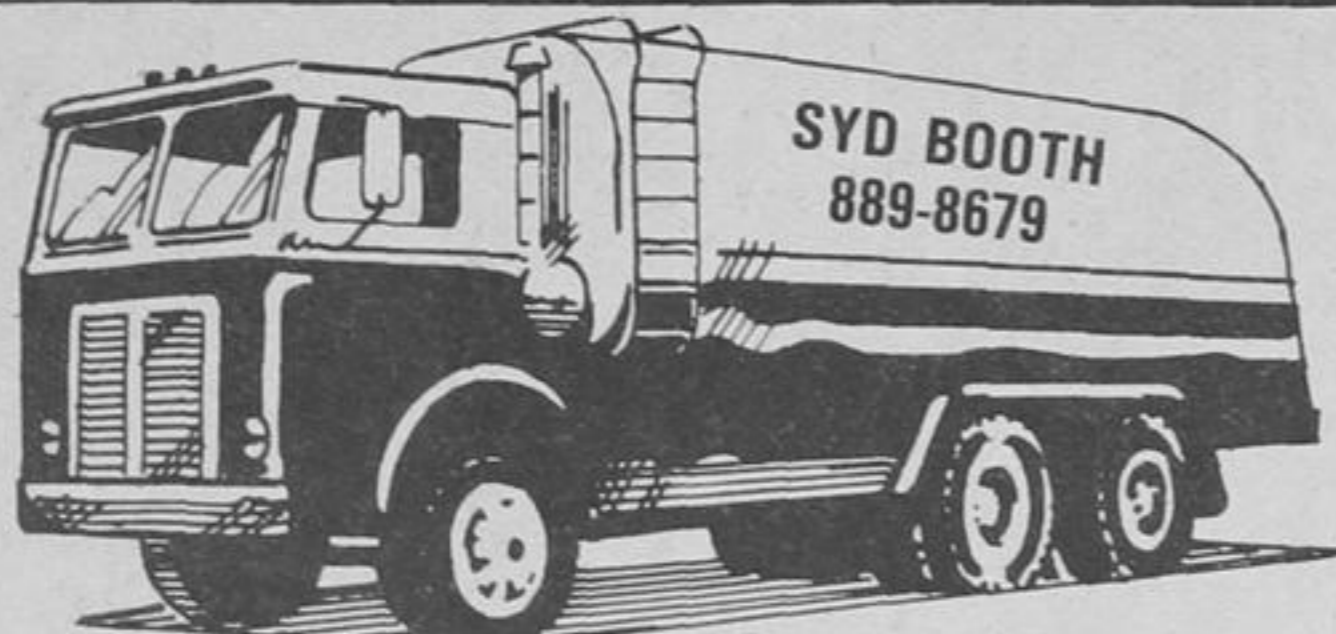
