

Police Briefs

Several Woodbridge residents were the victims of housebreakings September 14. A quantity of jewelry was taken from the home of Liberato Guida, 111 Jeanne Drive, when his home was looted.

On the same street, Lorenzo Demenechi of 157 Jeanne Drive is missing silverware and coins after his home was robbed.

Gerritt Nymann of 10 Riverview Avenue had his horse broken into, but nothing was taken, because the culprit or culprits were apparently frightened away.

Pasquale Pietrantonio of 37 Moonstone Place, Woodbridge is missing a quantity of foreign and Canadian currency as a result of a break in at his home.

JUVENILES ARRESTED

Five juveniles have been arrested and will appear in court October 17 as a result of a police investigation into vandalism and theft at St. Anthony's Separate School, Thornhill.

Two of the juveniles entered the school by means of a window on July 28 and took a quantity of school supplies and three tape recorders.

Four of the five juveniles entered four portable classrooms and caused damage estimated at \$2,500.

The five have been charged with malicious damage and possession of stolen items valued at more than \$200.

Sharen's job depends on public support

Helpmate Information is looking to the public to support its Volunteer Bureau, otherwise it appears the community service will have to be dropped.

The Canada Works Grant responsible for employing the Volunteer Bureau Co-ordinator, Sharen Smith, will expire October 26.

Helpmate Co-ordinator, Rhelda Stockall, said, "We just don't have the money to keep Sharen on after that date."

In January of this year the service was established in Richmond Hill to match volunteers with jobs available.

"The volunteer bureau is a central place where someone can get an overview of the kinds of volunteer jobs available in the community," said Mrs. Stockall.

A very high percentage of the placements have been people who have never done volunteer work before, she added, suggesting people wanted to volunteer before but didn't know where to go.

In the period from January to August, the Volunteer Bureau recruited 252 people for 45 different agencies in the region.

Mrs. Stockall said financial cutbacks in Social Services in the region have been "so tremendous" that all agencies must look to the volunteer sector to fill their needs.

Helpmate approached the Town of Richmond Hill asking for funding, but were advised it was too late in the year.

Mayor Dave Schiller said the town does not have any grant money available at this time of the year and advised Helpmate to go through the normal process of applying for grants between December and February.

Mrs. Stockall said Helpmate will look hopefully to the United Way for partial funding. The sum needed to keep the Volunteer Bureau alive is between \$5,000 and \$10,000, said Mrs. Stockall.

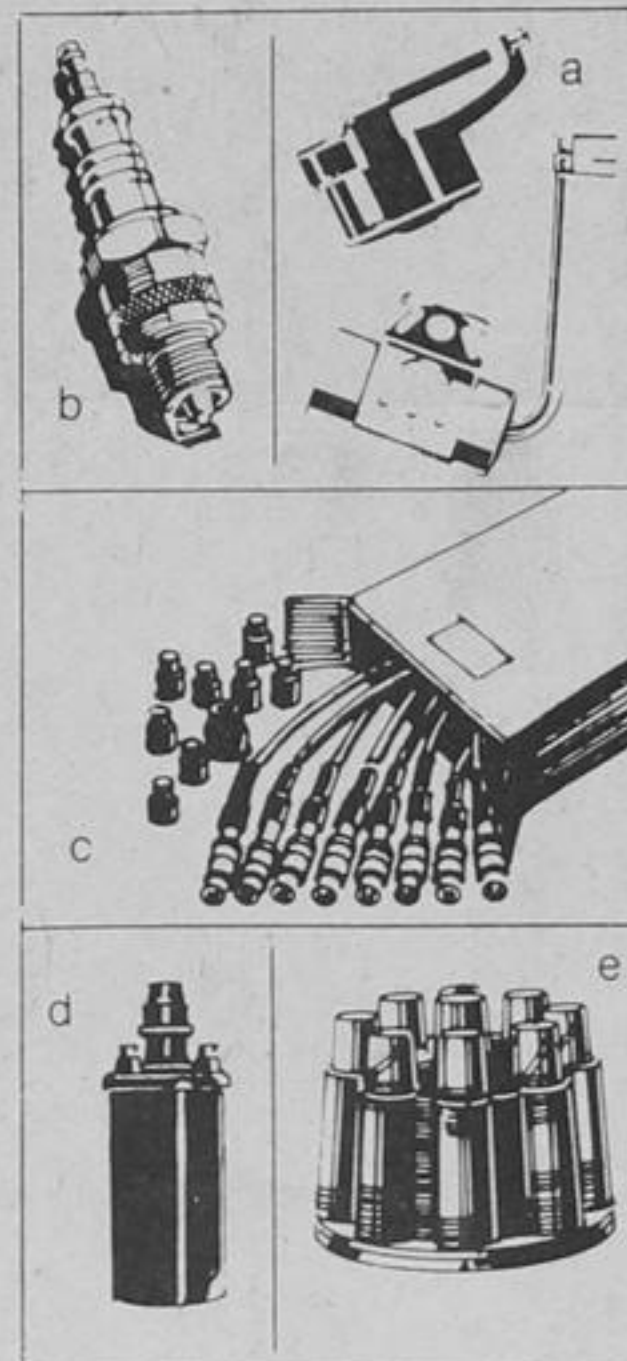
