Right now there are more than 60 Canadian titles in print.

Book club books are primarily fiction, but do include science, reference, historical and science fiction reading. Materials submitted

are carefully selected. "We know the kind of book that will go well," said the managing director.

Mr. McMaster said his company tries to respond to needs for any type of reading material related to children.
