**Spot rezoning will cause messy development - owners**

Many residents of Gamble Sideroad turned out Tuesday to oppose a planning staff recommendation to allow lot severances.

At least one property owner in the area has applied to the town for severance.

Planning staff were advised to study this area and have come up with a recommendation concluding at the present time severance of four corner lots could be supported.

This decision was arrived at after considering the impact on the character of the community and the concern of increasing the number of driveways on the sideroad. Gamble Sideroad is considered by

the town to be an arterial road and therefore could possibly carry a lot of traffic in the future.

Planning staff is satisfied the four new lots will not detract from the overall area and will be compatible, said Planning Commissioner Bill Power.

Property owners protested the recommendation on the grounds spot rezoning will lead to "messy development".

"Development may take place," said Jefferson Road resident Harvey Handley, "but when development comes, everyone should share in the benefits."

Fifteen letters were

produced to support severance of these four lots, eight property owners objected, four are neutral and seven property owners' opinions are in question.

Last Tuesday night, two planning committee members, Mayor Dave Schiller and Councilor John Birchall, voted against the recommendation because it did not meet the principle of the official plan which says no rezoning unless the majority of land owners are in favor.

This committee recommendation will come before council for consideration the first meeting in October.
